ORDINANCE NO. 49

Relating to the Erection of Sidewalks in Certain Portions of Patton—Prohibiting Hitching Posts.

An ordinance to regulate side walks or pavements, and directing the manner of construction of the same and the kinds of material to be used in constructing, replacing or repairing pavements or side walks along paved streets in the Borough of Patton, and providing for the removal of hitching posts along the same.

Be it enacted and ordained by the Burgess and Town Council of the Borough of Patton, and it is hereby enacted by authority of the same, That hereafter all side walks along streets which are now or may be hereafter paved with brick or other suitable material in the Borough of Patton, shall be constructed of well burned brick, concrete or flag stone.

That, whenever it becomes necessary to build, relay, replace or repair side walks along streets which are now or which may be hereafter paved with brick, none but well burned brick, concrete or flag stone shall be used, same to be laid on well tamped sand or cinder, and that the same shall be laid to the grades established by the Borough Engineer.

And it is further provided, that no hitching posts for the purpose of hitching horses shall be permitted to be placed or remain along any paved street within said Borough.

And it is further provided, that the Street Commissioner of said Borough shall be and is hereby directed and empowered to remove any and all hitching posts along said streets after notice to the owner of the property, and his neglect or refusal to do so.

All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

Enacted and ordained this the 14th day of August, 1899.
