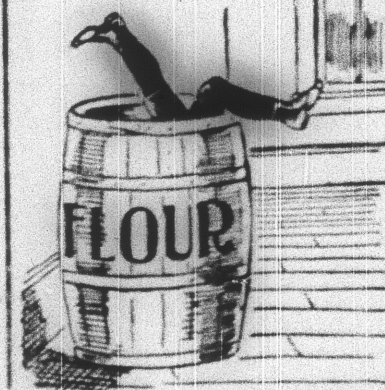

AMONG the many distinguished visitors to the Loretto Centennial Tuesday was that of Hon. Wm. A. Stone, Governor of the State of Pennsylvania. He was the guest of C. M. Schwab of the Carnegie Steel Company.

The Mountain Echo, one of the brightest and most ably edited exchanges which comes to our sanctum, has been removed from Osterburg, Bedford county, to Bedford, the county seat. We predict for the genial editor, Mr. Hendrickson, abundant success in his new field.

We would like to again call the attention of certain citizens in different portions of town to the practice of throwing tin cans, glass, etc., into the public thoroughfares. It is a dangerous practice in more ways than one, more particularly dangerous to horses passing to and fro on the streets. It should be stopped by all means.

"One common cow can create a disturbance almost equal to the worst demonstration of 40 riotous men when she starts on a rampage," says the Pittsburg Dispatch. "Fortunately few cows are aware of their power. Some, of course, have no disposition to raid city streets, but there are many that are wicked enough if they only know what devastation they could create. The average city dweller will flee from a cow at large with more abandon than he would from a locomotive off the rails and tearing up the ties—even from an innocent cow with no malicious intent." Yes, and we might add, in addition to the above, that they can and do destroy, in a single night, when the poor working man is taking his much needed rest, more dollar's worth of property (in an unprotected borough like Patton) than can be accumulated in a whole year.

The suggestion has been made in some quarters, that the United States exercise its good offices, to prevent hostilities between Great Britain and the Transvaal Republic, but the Administration officials do not deem it expedient, under all the circumstances of the case, to do so. It is not considered at all probable, that either of the two countries involved in the controversy, is likely to ask the assistance of the United States, or that it would be given if it were asked. Although this government would like to have the present trouble settled without war, McKinley does not feel called upon to volunteer to mediate between them. Of course, should the government of Europe, join in an appeal for a peaceful settlement of the question at issue, it is not unlikely that the United States would, in such a case, lend its best efforts in the same direction. There is no possibility of any independent action being taken on the part of the United States.

THE PRESIDENT'S conference with Admiral Dewey, before he left for the West, resulted in orders being issued at once for increasing the naval force now engaged in maintaining what is a practical blockade of the Philippines, by several more vessels, including the Brooklyn. It has been openly stated in Washington for some time past, that

a thriving trade was being carried on with the insurgent ports, and it has even been hinted that some of the officials over there were deriving a considerable profit from conniving at its continuance. Whether the latter be true or not, it is not easy to understand why the additional vessels were not sent some time ago if they were needed. The incident, however, shows how anxious the Administration is to identify itself in the popular mind with carrying out Admiral Dewey's wishes with regard to the Philippines, as there is no doubt that the people generally have almost implicit confidence in the Admiral's judgment.
