IN POSTHOUSE EIGHT HOURS.

Somerset Man Taken There Friday Evening Died at 3 A. M. Today.

John Grundy, a native of England, died at the Cambria County Poorhouse at 2 o'clock Friday morning, after being an inmate of the institution only eight hours. His death was due to heart disease induced by drapery. He also had lung trouble.

Mr. Grundy was born in Lancashire, England, fifty-four years ago, and came to Cambria County two years since. When taken ill he was living in a shanty at Wilmore with his brother-in-law, Daniel Harbaugh, who made the application for admission to the Poorhouse. Poor-Director Moore took the man up to Ebensburg Friday afternoon, arriving at the Poorhouse at 6 o'clock. Harbaugh was notified of the death but it is not expected that he will claim the body, and interment will probably be made in the Poor Farm Cemetery Sunday morning.

One writer recalls how he saw a man shot in Montenegro for appearing at a review wearing a stained uniform.

The deceased's wife is dead. He has several children living in England, but none in this country.
