Since 1890 the membership has increased not less than 75 per cent. New York at present has 501 subordinate granges with 41,000 members; Pennsylvania, 426 granges and 30,000 members; Maine 275 granges with 29,000 members; New Hampshire, 260 granges with 24,000 members; Michigan, 450 granges and nearly 25,000 members. These states lead, but the orders are also active and strong in Vermont and Connecticut, Ohio, Massachusetts. Thirty states pay dues to the national grange treasury, and twenty-four were represented by delegates at the last national grange... Ex.
