Summer Excursion Tickets.

On April 20, 1901, the Pennsylvania Railroad company placed on sale summer excursion tickets to Buffalo on account of the Pan-American Exposition and to Niagara Falls.

On May 1, 1901, the regular summer excursion tickets to all the principal summer resorts east of Pittsburgh and Buffalo were placed on sale at ticket offices of the Pennsylvania Railroad company.

These tickets bear the usual summer excursion limit of October 31, 1901, except that the Niagara Falls tickets will be good to return until November 30, 1901.

The Pennsylvania Railroad Summer Excursion Route Book for 1901 will be issued, as heretofore, on June 1.

Excursion Rates to Exposition.

Beginning April 30th, and continuing until Oct. 31st, the New York Central will sell excursion tickets to Buffalo and Niagara Fall on account of the Pan-American Exposition at special reduced rates, varying with different time limits and accommodations. Excursion tickets, good in first-class day coaches, but not in parlor or sleeping cars, within two to five days of date of issue are sold at lowest rates. Ten day tickets, thirty-day tickets and season tickets are also on sale. Specific rates, conditions and limit of tickets, time of trains, information as to hotels and boarding houses, etc., will be made known upon application to ticket agents.
