The accident is a sad blow to the parents, both being almost crazed with grief, yet there is at least a little consolation in knowing that both the unfortunate sons were excommunicated young men, possessed of considerable more than ordinary intelligence and morality. The funeral procession, which was the largest ever witnessed by the writer, arrived here at 12 m. Tuesday. Interment in Baptist cemetery. Funeral services were held in Baptist church, Revs. Sigmund and Berkeley officiating.

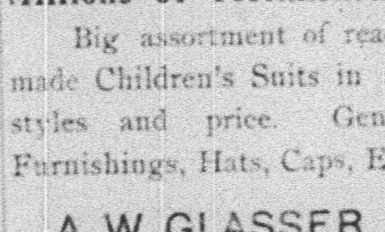
