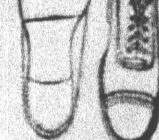

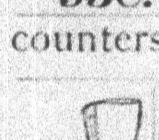

ORDINANCE NO. 66.

An ordinance prohibiting the spitting on the walls and floors of all public halls, churches, school houses, post office and other public buildings in the Borough of Patton. Be it enacted and ordained by the Board of Health of the Borough of Patton, and it is hereby enacted by authority of the same: That hereafter no person shall be permitted to spit or blow saliva or other matter from the mouth or nose on the floors or walls of any public hall, church, school house, post office or other public building in the Borough of Patton. Any person so doing may be arrested on sight by the police or other officer of the Borough, or upon information made before the Burgess or any Justice of the Peace, and upon conviction before any said Burgess or Justice of the Peace, shall be sentenced to pay a fine of not less than two nor more than five dollars along with costs of arrest and prosecution. Said fine to be turned over by said officer before whom conviction was had, to the Borough Treasurer. Enacted and ordained this, the 20th day of February, 1902.
