There isn't much to tell about the result of the election Tuesday outside of what is contained in the tabulated statements in this issue of the COURIES. Patton gave Democratic majorities all along the line, but the returns from the balance of the county show that this place was the exception rather than the rule.

Hubbard for the legislature received Hubbard for the legislature received a splendid vote in his home town, hav-ing a plurality over James of 216. The Working Class vote was a disappointment to the friends of Irvine and Fisher, especially when it was known that quite a number outside of the miners were giving these gentlemen their support. Irvine polled 208 votes in Patton and Fisher 159.

In Patton and Fisher 159. Bailey for Congress made a phenom-inal run here, polling about one vote for every six cast. 
