THE ELECTION AFTERMATH!

Patton Democratic, the County Was Republican.

BAILEY'S LARGE VOTE.

Popular Candidate for Congress Polled More Ballots in Patton Proportionately Than Any Place in the Entire District—Hubbard Received Nice Vote.

There isn't much to tell about the result of the election Tuesday outside of what is contained in the tabulated statements in this issue of the COURIER. Patton gave Democratic majorities all along the line, but the returns from the balance of the county show that this place was the exception rather than the rule.

Hubbard for the legislature received a splendid vote in his home town, having a plurality over James of 216. Strittmatter also did well here, having 175 more votes than Sherbine. The Working Class vote was a disappointment to the friends of Irvine and Fisher, especially when it was known that quite a number outside of the miners were giving these gentlemen their support. Irvine polled 208 votes in Patton and Fisher 159.

Bailey for Congress made a phenomenal run here, polling about one vote for every six cast. This is remarkable when it is considered that he was running on an independent ticket with no organization behind him and on a ballot that was so difficult to split that many voters voted a straight ticket rather than run the risk of casting a defective one. Blake, the Pennsylvania blacksmith, polled 32 votes in the borough.

Thropp has a majority over Reynolds in Patton of 98 votes, the same number cast for Bailey. Strauss for sheriff has 217 plurality in Patton, the largest ever given a county candidate. This was not due to any antipathy towards Griffith, but simply a protest against the despicable methods that forced Jesse E. Dale off the ticket.

Emery carried the borough by 117, while "Bob" Murphy's personal popularity cut down Black's plurality to 98.

ARRESTED IN ITALY.

Assailant of Patrick Campbell is in the Toils in His Native Land.

Monday morning District Attorney Leech received a letter from the Italian vice consul at Pittsburgh, giving the latest information concerning the case against Francesco Imbeisi, the Italian who is accused of killing Driver Hays, wounding Pat Campbell, and stealing nearly \$3,000 in the famous Portage hold-up a couple of years ago, and then made escape to Italy with the money.

The letter says Imbeisi has been arrested in Italy and that letters rogatory for the taking of testimony in this country were forwarded, but were found to be defective and were returned for correction. As soon as the new letters are received testimony will be taken and forwarded to Scala, where Imbeisi lives, and he will be tried there on the evidence taken in this country.

The information contained in the official communication to District Attorney Leech is borne out by private letters received by well known members of the Italian colony in Johnstown. These letters further say that when Imbeisi was arrested in Italy he said to his father: "I want you to take care of wife. It is all up with me now." It is also said that on searching Imbeisi's premises large sums of money were found.

PATTON WON'OUT.

Newly Organized Basket Ball Team Defeated the Boys of St. Francis College.

On Wednesday evening the Patton Basket Ball team defeated the St. Francis College team in a well played and interesting game at Loretto.
