FIRE WARDENS
WARNINGS OF FIRES
First warnings of the approach of the spring forest fire season were issued today from the office of the Commissioner of Forestry. Two-thirds of Pennsylvania's 1,100 forest fires last year burned between April 15th and June 1st, and everyone who visits the woods during these times of exceptional danger is asked to be more than usually careful with fire.

The Department of Forestry offers these suggestions to the man who does not want his favorite camping ground net year to be charred and disfigured reminder of his own carelessness:
Break your match in two before you throw it away.
Clean off a spot ten feet in diameter for your camp fire. Watch the fire all the time, and be dead sure it is out before you leave it.
