
# SENATOR BURLEIGH, OF MAINE, IS DEAD

#### Germans Take Guns and Prisoners at Kovel Fight.

Berlin --- German troops under General von Linsingen are holding in check the Russians advancing toward Kovel from the southeast. The Russians were repulsed on both sides of the Styr and nearly 3,500 prisoners, one cannon and 10 machine guils were taken by the Germans. Battles in the Air.

#### Electricity Kills Them, but Does Not Hurt Crops.


