

COMIC OPERA MIKADO AT SUNSET PARK FOR

For Benefit of Fire Companies at
Carrolltown, Patton, Barnesboro,
Spangler and Hastings

Perhaps the greatest musical event ever planned for the North end of Cambria County is now on the tapis. John Coville Dickson of Pittsburg who has been spending the summer at Ebensburg and while there has been training a chorus for a musical entertainment to be given at Ebensburg at an early date, was in this vicinity a few days ago, and at the suggestion of some of our good citizens, has decided to organize a chorus from among the singers in this vicinity for the purpose of producing the Opera Mikado at Sunset Park.

Mr. Dickson is a man of much experience in such work and ordinarily requests a one thousand dollar guarantee, but he was so much impressed with the conditions existing here that he has decided to produce the opera without a guarantee, accepting 50 per cent of the net proceeds, the balance to go to the Fire Companies in the several boroughs above mentioned with the understanding however, that in order that the Fire Company may become a beneficiary, the town in which the Fire Company is located must be presented substantially in the chorus.

Director Dickson predicts that if properly advertised and the local interest is aroused that there should be an audience of at least two thousand present.

Talent First Class

On Monday evening last about fifty singers met him at Sunset Park. These were largely from Patton and Carrolltown. He felt very much encouraged and encouraged and encouraged the chorus upon their ability to read music at sight as well as on the quality of their voices, their enthusiasm and evident pleasure in singing.

He says that he found unusual talent among those present and he attributed this largely to the excellent instruction given by our local teachers and especially complimented Mrs. Hattie Sharbaugh of Carrolltown.

He expects to have a chorus of at least one hundred and fifty voices. This would indeed be an interesting performance and one which should receive the active endorsement and support of every one in our midst and we trust that our local singers will respond to his request and join the chorus.

It is not to be supposed that Mr. Dickson can reach each individual but he desires to extend his invitation to every one who has any musical ability to join this chorus and not wait for an invitation.

HOUSES OF 17TH CENTURY WIRED FOR ELECTRICITY

Houses are never too old to wire. Throughout New England a number of very old houses have been wired for electric service.

The Cooper-Austin house, Cambridge, built in 1657, and the oldest residence now standing in the city, has been wired. The installation includes twenty-two 15-watt and six 25-watt Mazda lamps, with eight receptacles. The wiring is from overhead lines through the small pipe conduit enabling the leads to be carried into the house with minimum disturbance of its appearance. A Colonial porch lantern equipped with a 25-watt lamp is another appropriate feature. This house remained in one family for a period of 250 years.

The oldest house in Plymouth, built in 1664 by William Narlow, has been wired with nine 25-watt lamps all told, including the front parlour, dining room and front room. In both the above houses the chimneys have withstood the ravages of time with the good of little or no alterations.

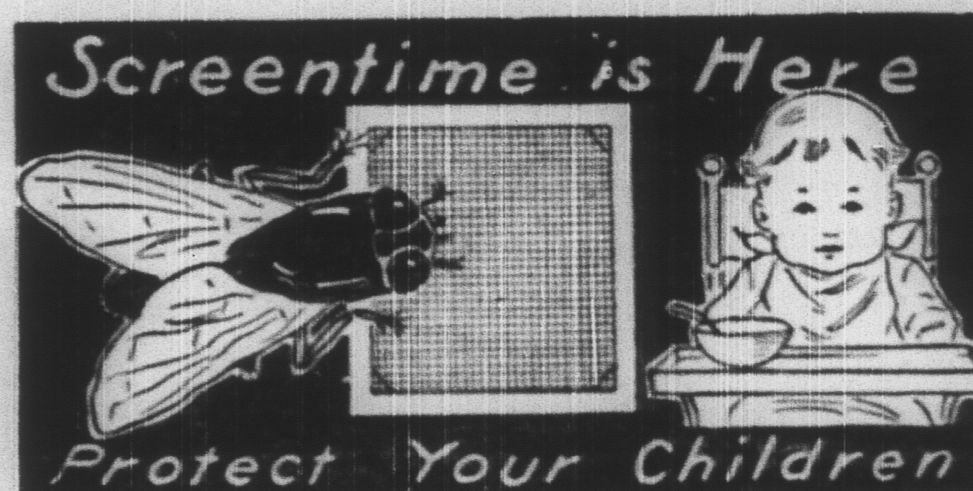

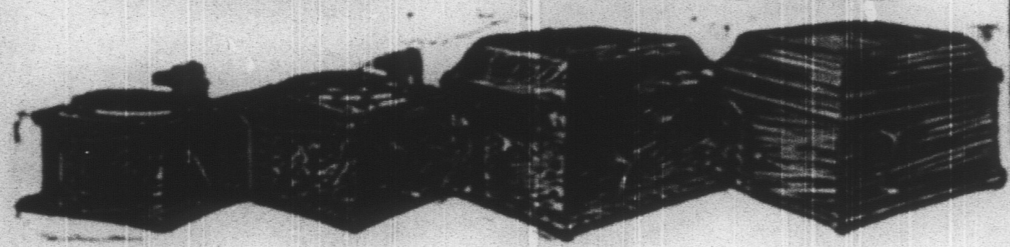
