### STATE AGRICULTURE NOTES

Poultrymen report breeding chickens very scarce this spring owing to the large number which were killed off during the fall and winter on account of the high cost of feed.

Pennsylvania ranked third in the production of potatoes during the past year, but only thirty-second in the average number of bushels produced to an acre.

Estimates show that seventy-five per cent of the farmers of the State use commercial fertilizers and that a total of 125,500 tons was used on the farms during the past year.

The average amount of commercial fertilizer used to an acre by the farmers of the state is 235 pounds and such farmer purchases each year an average of about two tons.

Estimates made by the Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture show 9,700 pure bred bulls in the state.

It is estimated that about sixteen per cent of the farmers of the State have stored ice during the present winter.

It is estimated that over 17,000 farmers are fattening steers for the spring market.

Lancaster ranks first, York second, Adams third, and Franklin fourth in the steer feeding industry. The northern part of the State is more noted as a dairy section.

PITTSBURGH RECOGNIZES MUSICAL MERIT OF SAN CARLO GRAND OPERA COMPANY
