Deplorable conditions resulting from public neglect of charitable institutions in England and other warring countries were cited recently by the Civic Relief Department of the Pennsylvania Committee of Public Safety as a reason for urging the continued support of the public for hospitals, charity organizations and other welfare agencies.

Letters have been issued by the Department to all contributors to privately supported organizations. The letter made this appeal:

"You have been in the past a contributor to privately supported welfare or charitable organizations. Will you not then consider the importance of continuing during the war your support to the agency or agencies which you have considered worthy of your support in time of peace? There is a great tendency among people today to fail to realize the necessity of maintaining standards of civilian life purely as a war measure. A healthy and well nourished citizenry is absolutely necessary to the successful prosecution of the war. Therefore, it is but logical reasoning to believe that organizations which are essential as supplemental forces to State and municipal departments in time of peace must be necessary in time of war. Unless the public recognizes very shortly the necessity for the maintenance of such organizations, many organizations which will be absolutely essential in the plans of the State will be obliged to go out of existence."

## TREE TALK

According to the latest figures, Pennsylvania raises less than a third of the timber her manufacturing industries use.

It has cost France over \$30,000,000 to learn that denuded forest areas must be reforested. Pennsylvania is learning the same lesson in the same way.

Of the 30,000,000 trees planted in the United States last year, Pennsylvania planted almost one-fourth.
