**FOUR BODIES ARE FOUND  
IN JUNIATA RIVER**  
Four of the bodies of men drowned  
in the Juniata River about ten days  
ago, when a small boat capsized near  
Lewistown, Pa., have been recovered.  
The body of J. C. Corbin was found  
about three-quarters of a mile from  
the scene of the accident Sunday aft-  
ernoon. Monday the bodies of Clair  
Miles, J. S. Barmon, and Christian  
Glass were recovered. The first body  
was about a mile from where the  
boat went down, the second was about  
two miles away, and the third about  
eight. All the bodies were floating  
when they were discovered.  
The search for the other three bod-  
ies was taken up with renewed vig-  
or Tuesday and the searchers had hopes  
of securing all of them.


