

ORDINANCE of the Borough of Patton, Cambria County, Pennsylvania, providing for grading, paving and otherwise improving certain portions of Fifth avenue from the bridge crossing Little Chest Creek and extending to the terminus thereof at the line of East Carroll Township; and the grading, paving and otherwise improving certain portions of Park avenue from Park to the terminus thereof at the line of East Carroll Township; and providing for the assessment of the cost of such improvements on the owners of real estate bounding or abutting on such streets.

WHEREAS, the municipal officers of the Borough of Patton are desirous of grading, paving and otherwise improving Fifth avenue from the bridge to Park, and of Park from Fifth to Mellon, and of Mellon from Park to the terminus thereof at the line of East Carroll Township; and have petitioned the Commissioners of Cambria County for aid in the grading, paving and otherwise improving said streets. And, Whereas, the Commissioners of Cambria County have entered into an agreement to contribute the sum of Ten Thousand Dollars towards the grading, paving and otherwise improving of said streets, the balance to be paid by the property owners bounding or abutting on the improvement and the Borough of Patton in such proportions as are authorized by law and herein provided for. And, Whereas, the Borough of Patton has accepted said offer and agreed to proceed with the work of re-constructing said streets as rapidly as possible.

IT IS THEREFORE ENACTED AND ORDAINED by the Burgess and Town Council of the Borough of Patton, and it is hereby enacted and ordained by authority of the same:

SECTION I. That Fifth avenue, from the bridge crossing Little Chest Creek to Park avenue; Park avenue from Fifth to Mellon; and Mellon avenue from Park to the terminus thereof at the line of East Carroll Township, be properly graded, paved and otherwise improved. That an engineer be employed to fix grades, prepare plans and specifications and that a contract be made for said work to be entered into with the lowest responsible bidder, after due advertisement.

SECTION II. That O. P. Thomas, the Engineer in charge of said work, shall make an estimate of the cost of the improvement when completed, and, after deducting the amount contributed by the County Commissioners of Cambria County, the balance of the total cost and expense of such improvement shall be assessed and collected in the manner herein after provided, two thirds of the cost and expense of the same from the owners of real estate bounding or abutting on such streets or highways, by an equal assessment on the feet front bounding or abutting as aforesaid.

SECTION III. That the municipal assessments for the grading, paving and otherwise improving said streets shall be filed with the Borough Sec-


