P. T. Davis, a Clearfield banker, was appointed county treasurer to fill a vacancy caused by death.

Twenty persons were injured, none seriously, in a head-on collision of interurban cars between Pittsburgh and Washington.

The Salvation Army campaign to raise \$12,000 for the Hazleton home service fund has reached \$9,000.

Only 50 per cent. of the applicants seeking certificates to work as miners in the Hazleton district passed the tests of the examining board.

Judge McCormick has appointed former Mayor John T. Capper, of Lock Haven, a County Commissioner, to fill the vacancy caused by the death of Adam Dickey.

Ralph Nichols of Greensburg and his wife, Smith Nichols and Pat Ward of Madison were injured Friday night when the automobile in which they were riding overturned. Mrs. Nichols suffered a fractured arm and Ward three broken ribs and a broken arm.

First Lieutenant John B. Pirelli of New Castle, officer in command of Troop F, Pennsylvania National Guard, since the resignation of captain and placed in command.
