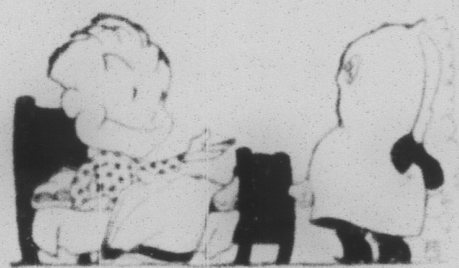


This ghost was a 1921 model

Mother's Cookbook

MEALS FOR THE WEEK

COMMINATIONS are always good in dinners. A great deal is made in blending the following though unusual very good. A cupful or two of milk with noodles was the base of this dish. A baking dish was prepared with the fat from a piece of fat, also a small bit of cold steak fat melted and put into the dish. A portion of the cooked meat, also sliced the noodles and the melted fat. A dish of creamed onions (which are also softeners) were chopped and added, and the whole covered with a layer of mashed potato, moistened with milk. Bake until the potato is brown and serve from the dish. Use such seasonings as are needed in arranging the food to the taste.

Liver With Onion Sauce.
Parboiled sliced calf's liver well washed, tearing in the boiling water and dip in flour well seasoned and fry in hot butter fat until well cooked. Fry a cupful of chopped onions in the remaining fat until a slight brown, add a tablespoonful of vinegar and pour over the liver.

Potato Frying Fat.
Cook the potatoes with the skins on, peeled and sliced in dice, with a handful of minced onion or a finely shredded onion. Now add finely minced tender unsalted fat and green. Mix all together and pour over hot bacon fat with the bacon added. In it, stir and mix well, then add a little boiling hot vinegar, salt and pepper and serve hot.

Wilted Cucumbers With Sour Cream.
Wash the cucumbers after peeling them and let them stand in cold water until wilted. Rinse in fresh water, lay out and dry on a cloth. Season with salt and pepper and serve with thick sour cream. They are liked by many people who consider cucumbers unwholesome if not soaked in salt water until all the crystals are removed. Cucumbers are indigestible to some people just as the least strawberry distresses some stomachs. Cooked fresh cream, cucumber dressed with a good salad dressing is a most digestible vegetable for the normal stomach.

Peanut Butter.
Four three cupfuls of cold water and one half cupful of oil and stir with a fork until the mixture is reached, but do not stir it up on a sieve, rinsing with water. Return the rice to the fire with a quart of boiling water and a small amount of salt, cover and cook until the rice is tender. Add a cupful of peanut butter, half a teaspoonful of paprika, an egg beaten light and a half cupful of milk. Mix all together well and shape in a mold on a buttered baking dish. Sprinkle with 1/2 cupful of cracked crumbs mixed with two tablespoonsful of fat. Bake half hour; serve hot with toast sauce. One may use a mixture of pork and veal and almonds ground.

Something to Think About THE JOB AND THE MAN

How much money did you spend last year on worth while books? Books you are reading to read a second time? Books that added to your wisdom or gave you something valuable to think about? How much time did you spend in filling your mental storehouse with facts useful in daily life and valuable in your daily work? Did you spend as much for information as you did for recreation? If you were to add together all the time you spent getting knowledge, would it be half the time that you spent reading?

Do you consider that MONEY is the only thing you spend? TIME is your most precious asset. You can earn more money.

You cannot, with all the wealth of all the universe in all the ages but one minute of time nor bring back for another and a better use a wasted hour. Lord Brougham, a man who spent his time wisely and profitably, wrote down this short sentence with good advice: "Read something of everything and everything of something." There is no excuse for any man a month or three past twelve years spending less than half an hour a day with a good book. Reading carefully and THOUGHTFULLY you will cover not less than 150 words a minute. That is 4500 words a day. ONE MILLION SIX HUNDRED THIRTY WORDS A YEAR. How much wiser do you think you would be if you did that for only one year?

Knowledge is the freest, the most inexpensive thing in the world and we think less of it than of anything else. Stop making a get of your stomach stop worrying about your clothes, give up some of the useless things upon which you spend and waste your time and your money. Make up a budget of your earnings and your hours that shall have in it a liberal allowance for your mind for your intelligence, for your thinking power. What you have inside your head no robber can get no flood can take for to his pocket. Not even old age can destroy it and perhaps not even death can take it away from you. Be generous with your mind. Feed it. Nurture it. Care for it. It is the one part of you that really matters the one thing upon which you should spend lavishly and conscientiously.

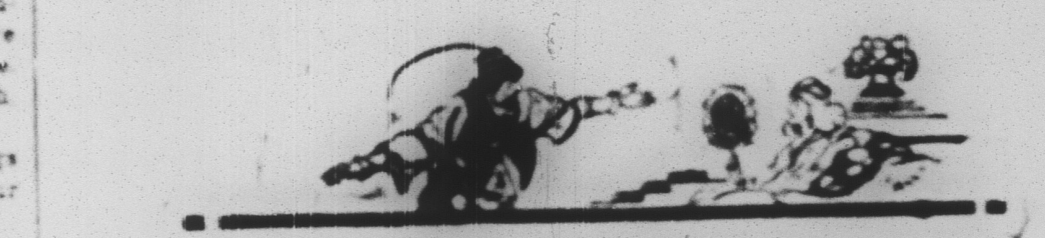
