Body of Carl Jones Arrives in Bakerton

Enlisted in Regular Army Soon After Declaration of War.

BAKERTON.—The body of Carl Jones, aged 22, who was killed in France Nov. 21, 1917, arrived here Sunday morning and was taken to the home of his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Frank Jones of this place. The funeral took place at 2 o'clock Tuesday afternoon from the Bakerton M. E. Church, with interment in the church cemetery, where the military

ritual was conducted by members of the Rose-Jones post, American Legion.
Carl Jones was born in Danio, Nov. 21, 1895, and enlisted in the United States regular army May 1, 1915, a short time after the declaration of war. Prior to enlisting he was employed in the mines of the Sterling Coal Co. and was a member of the United Mine Workers of America.
Besides his parents, Carl Jones is survived by the following brothers and sisters: John, Paul and Leroy Jones, all of this place; Mrs. Samuel Grazer, Kelso; Mrs. Silas Nichol, Somerset county; and Freda Jones, at home.

Prominent Democrats to Place Their Names Upon Ballot.

The names of attorney John H. McCann, of Ebersburg, and Attorney Harry Doerr, of Johnstown, will be placed upon the ballots at the primary election September 20, for the Democratic nominations for judges of Cambria County, if the efforts of a large and representative following prevail. In compliance with the necessary legal requirements, petitions are being circulated and freely signed as the initial move.
The movement to name the two attorneys as the candidates of the Democrats of the county for the judicial positions has been talked for some time, but the gossip did not assume definite shape until last week, when a number of prominent Democrats started the circulation of the petitions.
Both Attorney McCann and Doerr are prominent leaders of the party

Nation's Per Capita Wealth Now \$2,800

The per capita wealth of the United States has increased \$200 since 1914. It was announced by the Government Loan Organization.
It is estimated that on Feb. 1, 1921, the total wealth of the country was \$200,000,000,000. This is an increase of \$20,000,000,000 during the last seven years.
If this wealth were divided equally among the 117,000,000 persons in the country, each would have \$2,800. In 1914 each would have had \$2,600.
The practice of thrift during the war was partly responsible for the increase according to the Loan organization.
