EBENSBERG—Announcement was made here Monday that the county commissioners had executed with the Morris Nathan estate a lease for the rooms in the Woolf block, Franklin and Lincoln streets, Johnstown, to be used as a meeting place for the board

of permanent jurors. On occasion also, it is understood, the rooms will be used for hearings in chambers authorized by Presiding Judge John E. Evans.

For many years the late Judge Francis J. O'Connor had his law offices in the Woolf block and during his first term had hearings in chambers there.

The rental charged by the Nathan estate for the rooms is \$100 a month, including light, heat and janitor service.

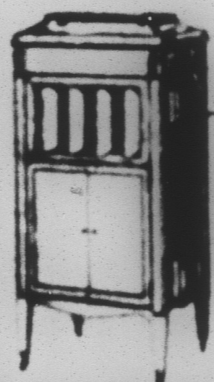
