State Brieflets

Miss Mae L. Smith, of Harleton, has sailed for Poland to do Red Cross relief work.

Bonuses ranging from \$50 to \$100 were given to all foremen, bosses, clerks and other monthly men around the mines of the Lehigh Valley Coal Company.
