County Seat Merchant Expires Yesterday; Funeral Held Yesterday Afternoon.

EBENSBURG—Fergus C. Lloyd, aged 64 years, died at his residence here on Crawford street at 11:40 o'clock Sunday night, death being due to heart trouble. His death was very sudden, Mr. Lloyd having been about the house all day and apparently being in good health.

The deceased was born in Ebensburg on September 20, 1858. He was a son of John and Sarah (Cannon) Lloyd, both deceased. Fergus C. Lloyd and Olive Kinland, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. H. Harrison Kinland, of this place, were united in marriage at the local Presbyterian Church on November 26, 1883. He is survived by his widow and three children, Lucile M., wife of W. H. Watson, Pittsburgh; Smith A., wife of Fred F. Lloyd, Harrisburg; and Fur-

gus C. Lloyd, Jr., at home. One brother, Harry Lloyd, of this place, also survives.

Mr. Lloyd was a member of Summit Lodge, Free and Accepted Masons and Mountain Forest, No. 44, Tall Cedars of Lebanon. He had served as Fire Chief of the Dauntless Volunteer Fire Company for a number of years. The deceased was a member of the Board of Trustees of the Park Auditorium. Mr. Lloyd was a lifelong member of the Presbyterian Church, of which he was an Elder for a number of years. He and his brother, Harry, were engaged in the mercantile business here.

Funeral services were held at 2 o'clock Wednesday afternoon in the Presbyterian Church. Interment was made in Lloyd Cemetery.

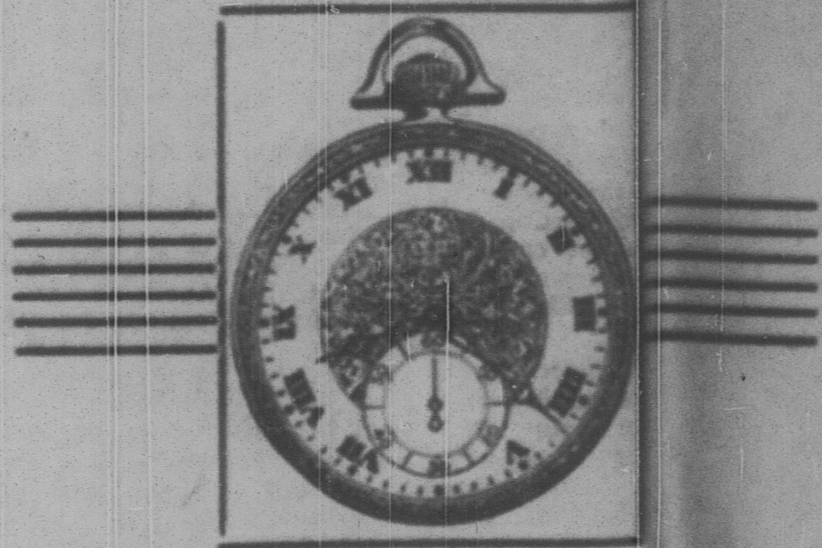

Robbed Pennsylvania Station at Carrolltown.

L. A. Glasser, charged with breaking and entering and larceny, on information sworn out by Sergeant W. C. Snyder, of the Pennsylvania Railroad police, was arrested at Carrolltown Monday by Captain H. G. Olson, of the railroad police, on a warrant sworn out before Justice of the Peace F. W. Vail.

Glasser was taken to the Carrolltown jail and was turned over to await the June term of court.

It is alleged that Glasser entered the Pennsylvania Railroad station at Carrolltown on the night of November 2, 1914, and stole \$2479 in cash belonging to the company, and a pair of field glasses, the property of station agent O. E. Hurd. The field glasses were recovered in a pawn shop in Altoona by railroad detective. Glasser had himself signed the pawn ticket, according to those interested in the case, the hand writing on the pawn ticket corresponding to Glasser's signature in possession of the railroad company. It is said Glasser had served time in the Western Penitentiary.

Adolph V. Apple Meets Death While Walking Along Branch of P. R. E. Near Ebensburg.

EBENSBURG—Adolph V. Apple, aged about 45 years, of Juniata, near Altoona, was instantly killed about 4:30 o'clock Friday afternoon when he was run down by a train on the Cresson & Clearfield Branch of the Pennsylvania Railroad, the accident occurring about one mile west of here. His body was severed at the waist, one portion being found about 31 feet from the other. It is believed that he was walking along the railroad and failed to notice the approaching train on account of the dense fog. The mangled body was found by workmen from the Revere mine on route here.

Death of Foreign Man Is Mystery. PORTAGE—Sleazy surrounds the death of Mark M. Whitman, aged about 20 years, residing about two miles from here, who died suddenly at his residence Tuesday morning. The supposition is that Whitman had swallowed some strychnine tablets. Coroner M. W. Swab, of Johnstown, was notified and made an investigation yesterday. It is said that Whitman had visited Dr. C. J. Hiss of this place, last Saturday afternoon and carried with him a quantity of strychnine tablets.

NOTICE OF PUBLIC MEETING

Notice is hereby given that the election of a School Director of the School District of Patton Borough, Cambria County, Pennsylvania, duly passed and approved by the Board of School Directors of the said school district, on the 10th day of April, A. D. 1922, and a special election will be held on Tuesday, the 10th day of May, A. D. 1922, between the hours of 7 A. M. and 7 P. M. at the Elmer's Hall in the First ward, and the Kelly building on Fifth avenue, in the Second ward, Patton Borough, being the places for the holding of general and municipal elections in the Borough of Patton, Pennsylvania, and by the officers provided by law for the holding of general and municipal elections, for the purpose of obtaining the consent of the qualified electors of the said School District of Patton Borough to an increase of the indebtedness of the said school district. The Board of the School District of Patton Borough, by resolution, passed the 3rd day of April, 1922, has authorized and empowered their officers for such increase of indebtedness.

The following statement is made by the School Board of said School District in pursuance of the Act of Assembly and the amendments thereto in such case made and provided:

1. The amount of the last assessed valuation of taxable property in said school district is \$1,666,580.00
2. The total amount of the present indebtedness of the said school district, ascertained in the manner required by law is 29,150.00
3. The amount of the proposed increase in the indebtedness of said school district is 35,000.00
4. The percentage of the proposed increase of indebtedness of the School District of Patton Borough (computed from the last assessed valuation thereof) is 2.1 per centum, (2.1 + %) of the amount of the last preceding assessed valuation of the taxable property of the School District of Patton Borough.
5. The proposed increase of indebtedness of the School District of Patton Borough for the purpose of using the proceeds thereof in purchasing or acquiring a lot of ground and to erect thereon a new high school building such as is needed and required in said school district, and to make needed and necessary repairs to the present public school building in the 2nd school district.

The proposed amount of debt is submitted to the qualified voters of the School District of Patton Borough for their approval or rejection in accordance with the Act of Assembly, and the several amendments and amendments thereto in such case made and provided and in pursuance to a resolution of the School Board of the School District of Patton Borough authorizing the same and for the purpose aforesaid.
