**WILLIAM HAYES, 70,  
HAS PASSED AWAY**

Was Brother of Driver Charles Hayes, Killed by Highwaymen in 1904.

William Hayes, aged 70 years, who at one time resided in Johnstown, died Wednesday at his home in Punxsutawney, Jefferson County, where he had been ill for a long time. His widow survives him.

The deceased was a brother of Charles Hayes, a driver for the Puritan Coal Company, who was killed by highwaymen on Saturday morning, July 30, 1904, while he and Paymaster Patrick Campbell, of the same company, were conveying \$3,000 from the Portage Station to Puritan to pay the miners. Patrick Campbell was badly wounded and was a patient in one of

the Altoona hospitals for some time following the holdup. Charles Hayes was 49 years of age and was laid to rest soon after his murder in St. Bartholomew's Catholic Cemetery, Wilmore, where mass was said by the Rev. Father James Egan, now of Altoona.

**James, Marcel and Gust Butler  
in Jail Awaiting Court  
Trial.**

James, Gust and Marcel Butler were placed under arrest Tuesday on a warrant sworn out before Squire H.

J. Buck, and committed to the Ebensburg jail on the charge of robbery. They were discovered removing a stove and other furniture and utensils from the J. W. Madigan Camp, near the Burns school house, on Monday and hiding same in a nearby woods, by John Eikenrode. On Tuesday they again appeared on the scene and were in the act of removing the stolen goods to their home at Elmora, when they were placed under arrest by Constable George Buck. The authorities believe with this arrest a number of robberies will be cleared up. The Burns school house was broken into about a month ago. A United

States flag was torn into shreds, lead pencils were broken and scattered about the floor and on Sunday the Snyder school house was treated in the same manner. Reports have it that a search made of the Butler home disclosed a number of articles corresponding with the losses in the schools and other places. The school authorities of East Carroll Township are taking an inventory of their losses. ASSISTANT SCHOOL OFFICIAL RESIGNS One of Contenders in Merry Race for County Superintendency

EBENSBURG.—Announcement was made here Friday that Prof. Victor D. Mulhollen has tendered his resignation as Assistant County Superintendent of Schools, effective March 1. He has served as assistant to Superintendent M. S. Bentz since September 1, 1915. Considerable interest in being manifested in the election of the County Superintendent at the meeting of the School Directors of Cambria County, which will be held here in the spring. A Superintendent will be elected to serve for a term of four years. It is understood that Prof. Bentz will be a candidate for re-election and will have as his opponents Prof. J. C. Wil-

liams, principal of Ebensburg High School, Prof. Daniel Williams, principal of Belsano High School, and Prof. Mulhollen. STATE POLICE ACTIVE HARRISBURG.—During January the State Police made 825 arrests and recovered stolen property valued at \$34,029.92, according to the monthly report today. Of the arrests 222 were for automobile thefts and 112 for liquor violations.
