VOLLEY QUELLS PRISON MUTINY

Fourteen Convicts Are Shot, Two Possibly Fatally, at Columbia, S. C.

LASH ENDS RIOT IN CHICAGO

Prisoners Attempt To Burn Penitentiary Shop Factory—Police Aid Guards Putting Down Mutiny—Hot Guns Used.

Columbia, S. C.—A mutiny of 150 convicts in the State penitentiary was put down today. Fourteen of the prisoners had been killed by penitentiary guards and police, two of them being possibly fatally shot. An attempt by the convicts to burn the penitentiary shop factory failed.

The riot broke out after the dinner hour. The convicts were silent because they had been ordered to turn in what they had with them in prison. Through the apparent leaders, they called the authorities, and announced they would not return to work. The rioting of city authorities by force.

No effort was made to coerce the prisoners during the arrival of reinforcements from the city. In the meantime the convicts stood in the penitentiary yard armed with sticks and knives, and from the chair factory.

Upon the arrival of the detachment of city police the mob of prisoners surged toward the little group of blue-coated officers, crying and making threats. They then rushed upon the men and were dropped. The remainder fled to the roof. They were rounded up without further trouble.

Chicago—A five-hour riot in the Cook County Jail was quelled when the ward guards removed ring-leaders from their cells one at a time and whipped them. Displeasure of the warden over a change in the method of admitting visitors led to the riot. Flaming blankets were dropped in the ground floor. Dense smoke almost suffocated many inmates. The riot broke out from their beds in prisoners' cells upon the bars of the cells, the bedlam being heard in the street.

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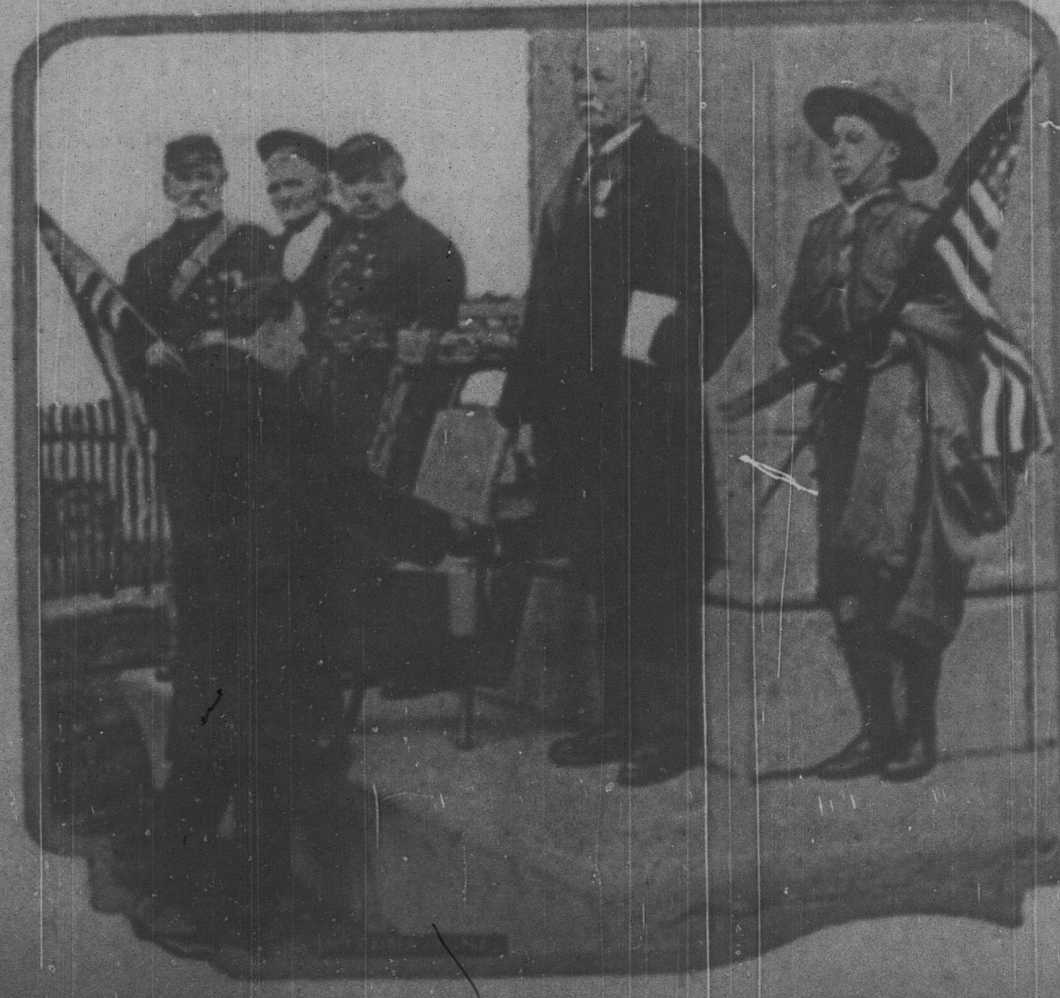
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Homage Paid to Lincoln in London

CLIMBED A FAMOUS PEAK



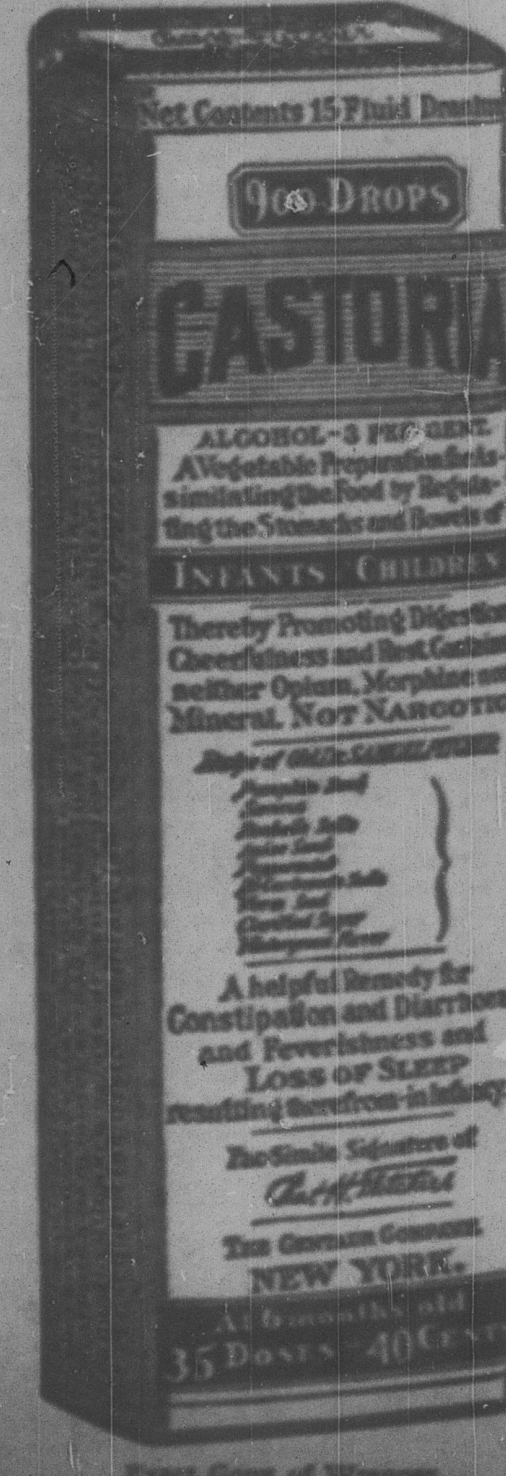
