Actual Bank Statement. NEW YORK—The weekly actual bank statement Saturday showed the following changes: Surplus increased \$4,541,550; loans discounted, etc., increased \$67,105,000; cash in own vaults, members Federal Reserve Bank, decreased \$963,000; reserve in Federal Reserve Bank of member banks increased \$6,918,000; reserve in own vaults State banks and trust companies decreased \$81,000; reserve in deposit State banks and trust companies increased \$38,000; net-demand deposits increased \$14,240,000; time deposits increased \$18,067,000; increased \$201,000; aggregate reserve \$548,742,000; excess reserve \$13,411,829.
