Federal Funds Aid States.
WASHINGTON, D. C.—Allotments of \$400,000 of Federal funds to States co-operating with the Government in protecting forest lands from fire have just been completed by the Forest Service, United States Department of Agriculture.

This sum, together with at least an equal amount which must be supplied by the States co-operating, is expended jointly by Federal and State agencies in protecting from fire, forest lands at the headwaters of navigable streams. The allotment is made on the basis of timbered area and cost of adequate protection. The Federal expenditure in any State is restricted to not over \$24,000.

According to the Forest Service, although the money is insufficient to insure adequate forest fire protection, it has in connection with State funds enabled substantial progress to be made in that direction.

Allotments to the various States are: Maine \$24,000, New Hampshire \$24,000, Vermont \$24,000, Massachusetts \$24,000, Rhode Island \$24,000, Connecticut \$24,000, New York \$24,000, New Jersey \$24,000, Pennsylvania \$24,000, Maryland \$24,000, Virginia \$24,000, West Virginia \$24,000, North Carolina \$24,000, Tennessee \$24,000, Louisiana \$24,000, Texas \$24,000, Ohio \$24,000, Michigan \$24,000, Wisconsin \$24,000, Minnesota \$24,000, South Dakota \$24,000, Montana \$24,000, Idaho \$24,000, Idaho south \$24,000, Washington \$24,000, Oregon \$24,000 and California \$24,000.
