**Body Found Near Cresson.**  
CRESSON—The body of a man  
thought to be A. D. Kaufmann of  
1935 Wightman street, Pittsburgh  
was discovered Wednesday evening  
at 5 o'clock in the woods near Hugue-  
town by Daniel O'Donnell. Kauf-  
mann had been missing from his  
home for a week and communication  
with Pittsburgh relatives seems to  
establish the identity beyond ques-  
tion. The man had been shot in the  
breast, the bullet apparently passing  
through the heart, and the body was  
found a short distance off the Wil-  
liam Penn highway. It is thought  
that he had been dead three or four  
days.

The O'Donnells were walking  
through the woods late this afternoon  
when the fatigued hunter stumbled over  
the corpse. A post-mortem examination showed  
that the man had been dead for some  
time and without disturbing the body  
Mr. O'Donnell immediately came to  
Cresson and notified Justice of the  
Peace Veil and Chief of Police A. M.  
Kearney of his discovery. The police  
officer went at once to the scene and  
examined the corpse finding the bul-  
let wound and establishing the fact  
that death had ensued some time be-  
fore. Coroner M. W. Swabb and  
District Attorney D. P. Weimer were  
notified and orders given to leave  
the body as it was found until an in-  
vestigation can be made.

**Jean Ann Bauman Expires.**  
Jean Ann, the two-months-old daugh-  
ter of Mr. and Mrs. Phil Bauman,  
of Patton, died at the parental home  
Tuesday. The funeral services were  
held from St. Benedict's church,  
Interment was in St. Benedict's  
cemetery. The deceased is survived  
by her parents and a sister.

gating she discovered the aged man  
leaning against a tree. He was in a  
very weakened condition due to in-  
sufficient nourishment and exposure  
being minus a hat or coat. Mrs.  
Stevens returned to her home and  
called the Tibbott drug store. Mr.  
Tibbott answered the telephone and,  
accompanied by a member of the

State Police, drove to where the man  
had been found.

They assisted him to the car, tak-  
ing him to the hospital at the Coun-  
ty Home.

A rudely shaped knapsack made  
from oilcloth was found near where  
the missing man was discovered, and  
it is thought that it contained pro-  
visions which he had purchased when  
last seen in Ebensburg. It is reported  
that Mr. Tudor is recovering from  
his experience.
