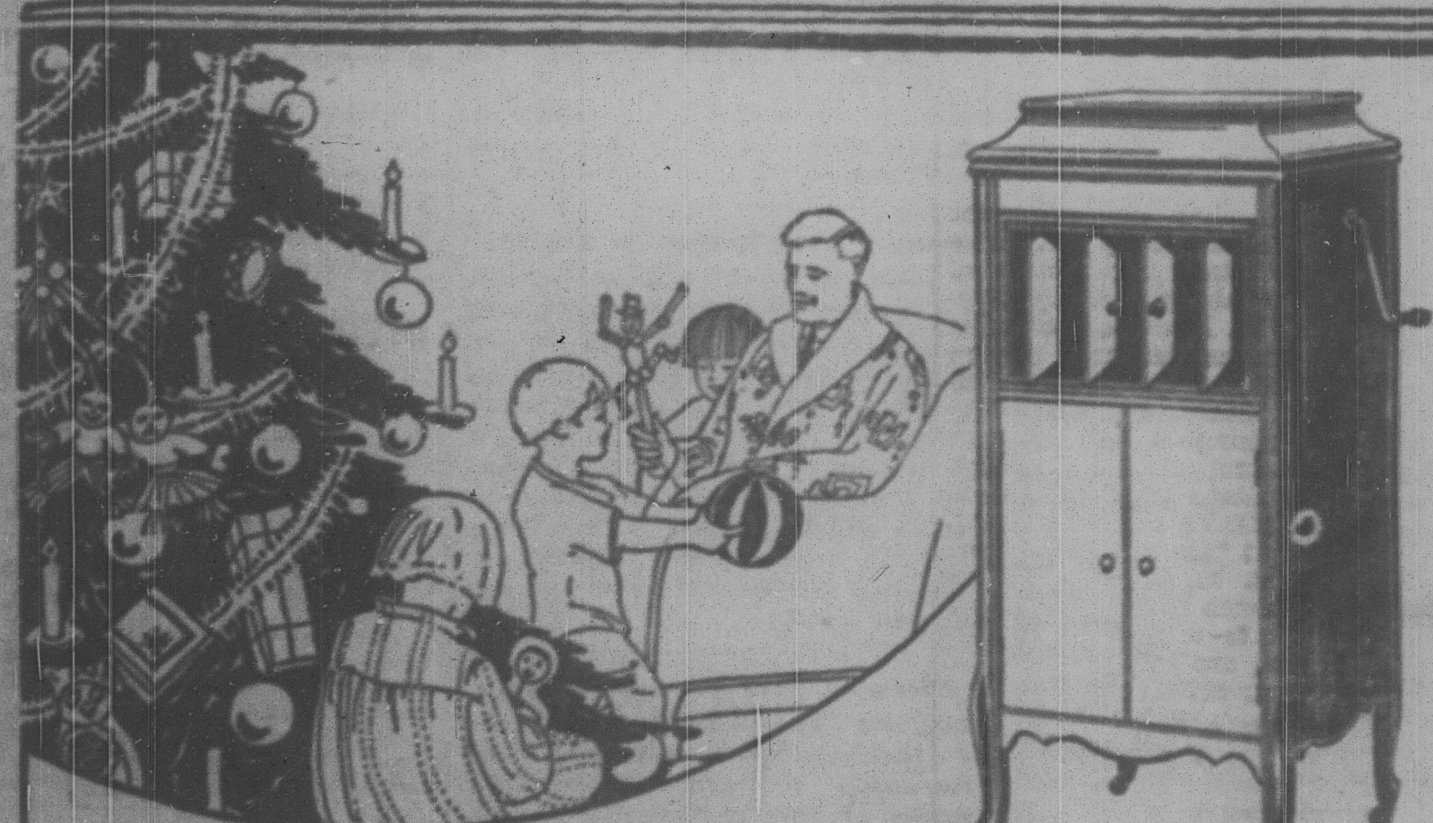

**WHAT'S IN A TELEPHONE?**

Few people know that in order to manufacture the innocent little telephone that stands on the desk it is necessary to bring to the factories articles from practically every corner of the globe.  
 There are twenty different minerals, fabrics and the like, used in the manufacturing process. Of course, many of the articles are obtained right here at home. Such things as gold, silver, copper and wood are secured in the western part of the United States. Iron, lead, zinc, nickel and aluminum, as well as coal and cotton, are received from the eastern and southern parts of the country.  
 But copper must be secured from the southern part of Africa; linen comes from Eastern Europe; silk from India; tin from Malaya; silk and shellac from China; platinum from Russia and from South America is obtained rubber and asphaltum.  
 The essence has the earmarks of an international collection, and it is easily to be seen how difficult would be the shipping if it were not for the present day efficient scheme of world commerce.

**TELEPHONE LINES BECOME LITERALLY 'AS BUSY AS BEES'**

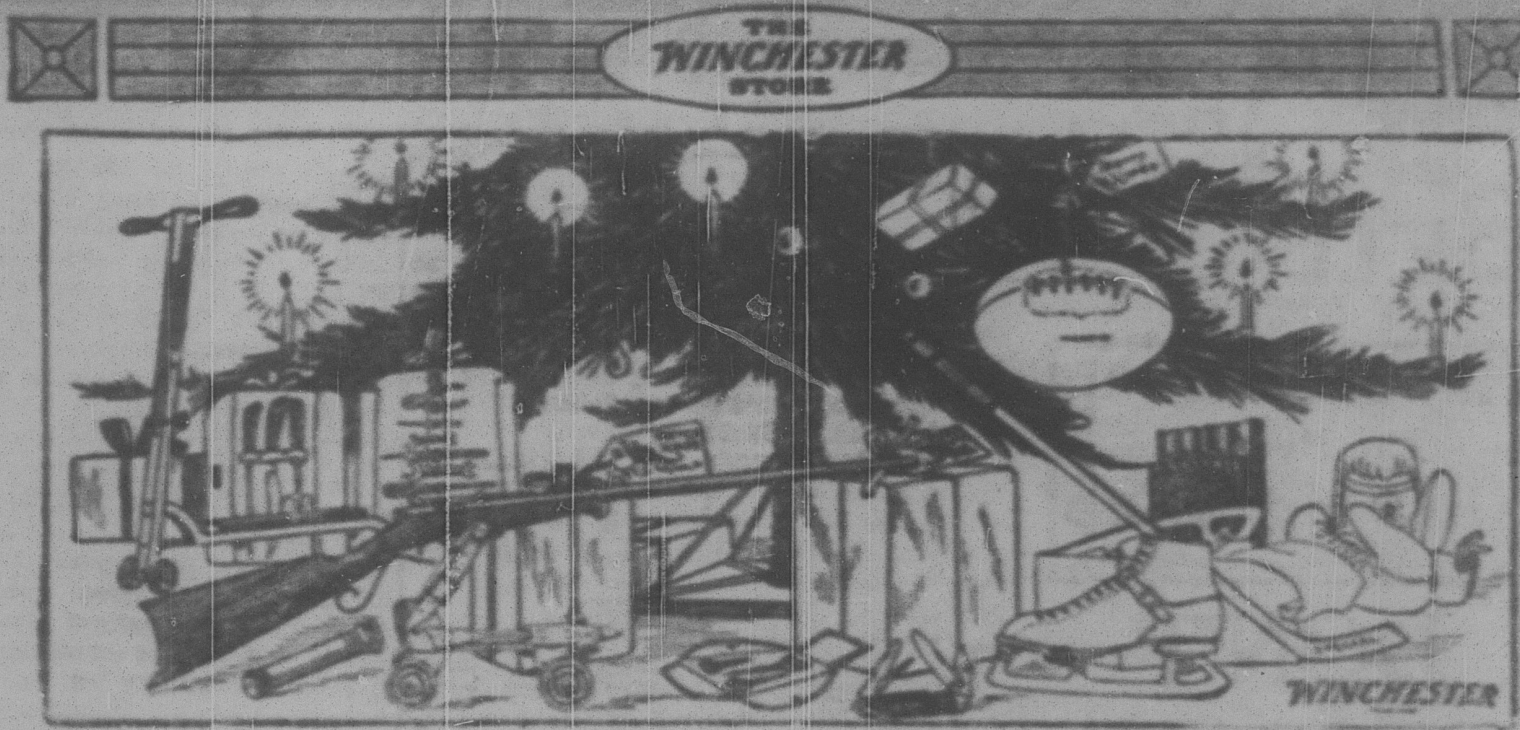
