Harrisburg—Condorsport, Potter county, has established a municipal forest, the first community in the State to take advantage of the Act of 1909 authorizing municipalities to acquire forest land for timber production, according to Major R. Y. Stuart, Chief Forester. The tract comprises about 100 acres of mixed hardwoods.

Ridgway—Mrs. William Myrtle, aged 36, a widow and mother of six small children, committed suicide at her home in Dugas Mines, when she blew the top of her head off with a heavy revolver the muzzle of which she placed in her mouth before firing. The suicide occurred in the second story of her home. Other persons in the house were attracted by the noise of her falling body, not having heard the shot.
