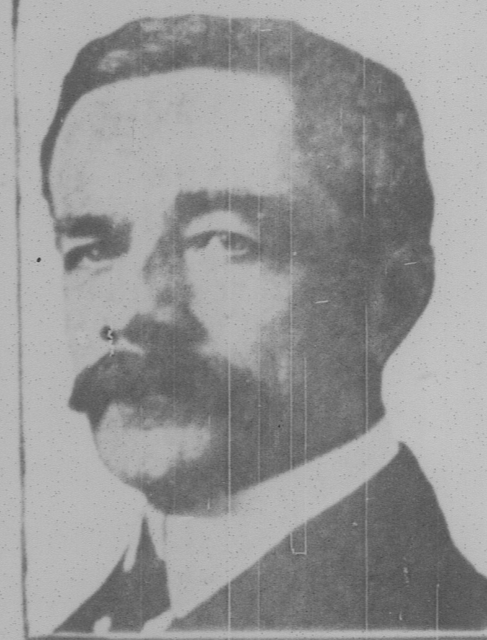

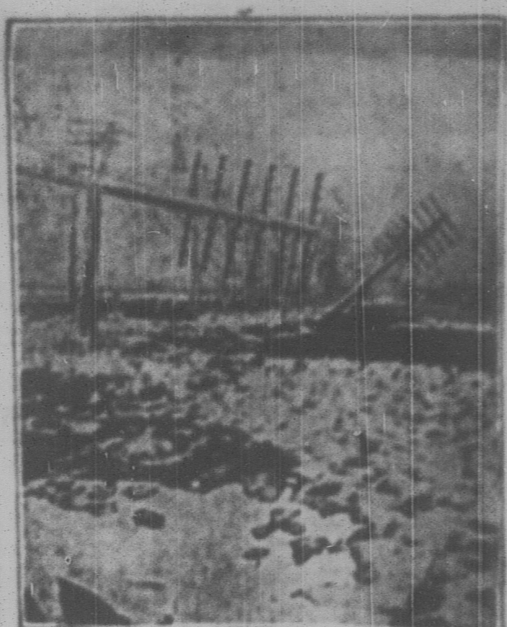

State Notes.

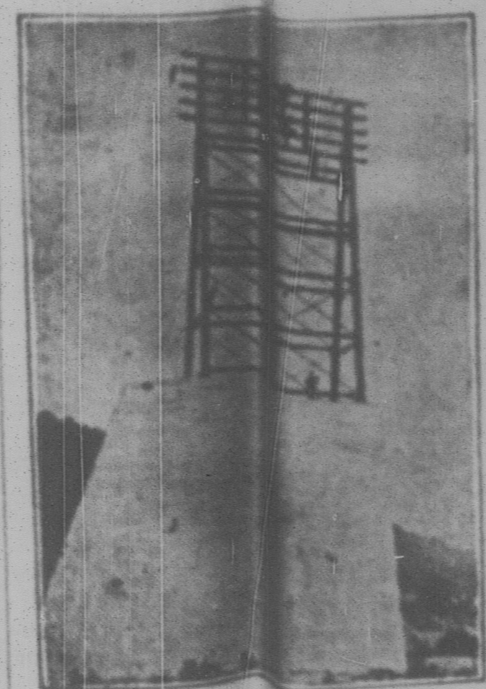
Oil City—The National Transit Pump and Machine Company of this city has received orders for 20 large pumps to be used in the Russian oil fields. The order was received from the Soviet Government and was placed through the Earnhart corporation.

York—Dr. J. H. Siding, of Shrewsbury township, York county, revived the celebration of the "Feast of Roses" at Manheim, Lancaster county, where he formerly lived. It was he who discovered in some old records that the congregation of the Lutheran church at Manheim was required to pay annually one white rose in the month of June as rental for the ground upon which the church stood. Payment is made to a descendant of the Baron Von Siegel who was the old ironmaster of Manheim many years ago.

New Castle—Mrs. H. B. McClima was seriously burned while preparing to go to church when her clothing caught fire, following the explosion of a gas stove in the bathroom. Her sons, Donald and Harold extinguished the flames with a woolen blanket.

Shenandoah—Alben Elgin, thirteen years old of Ashtab, was shot and killed when John Curley, his friend, was placing a shotgun in a rack. The weapon was accidentally discharged. Curley and Elgin had been inspecting traps and the accident occurred when they returned home. Young Curley is prostrated with grief.

Gettysburg—Increasing interest in the historic battle at Gettysburg where the decisive battle of the Civil War was fought July 1, 2, and 3, 1863 has been developing among Americans since the World War, in the opinion of members of the Gettysburg Commission. 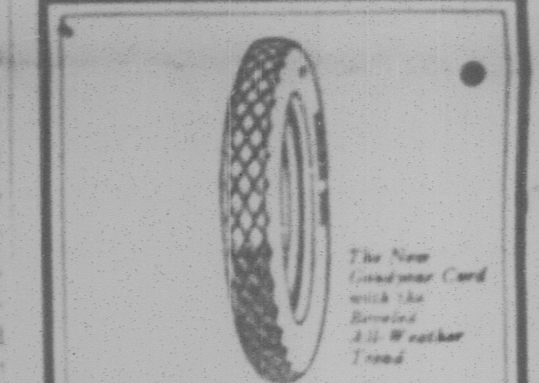
Immense plant to carry telephone lines across Susquehanna at McCall's Ferry.
