Dumping of ashes or any other filth in the creek must cease and the residents must have their refuse hauled out of the borough, health officials announced. All persons having pigs in the borough of Summerhill must have the pens cleaned up. The Board will take action.

Edna Melhorn Funeral Wednesday.

ASHVILLE—Funeral services for Miss Edna Melhorn, aged 18 years, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Edward Melhorn, of this place, who died Saturday after a few weeks illness, were held in St. Thomas' Catholic Church at 10 o'clock Wednesday morning. Burial was in the church cemetery. Her parents, one brother, Glen, and two sisters, Grace and Mildred, survive.

Portage Votes Bond Issue.

Portage voters Tuesday approved the proposed \$30,000 bond issue at a special election a majority of more than 200 votes being cast in favor of the

proposal. The issue which dates back for some time, brought out a total of 813 voters and members of the borough council look upon the majority vote in favor of the bond issue as an endorsement of their acts while in office.

South Fork Man Hurt.

Investigation is being made into the circumstances surrounding the injury of Samuel Reighard, who was admitted to Memorial Hospital, Johnsonburg about 8:30 Monday evening in an unconscious condition and suffering from a fracture of the skull and other injuries. Reighard is believed to have fallen from the back porch of his boarding house at South Fork on Saturday night. He was not found until

about 7:30 o'clock Monday evening. His condition is regarded by hospital authorities as critical, paralysis having spread over the entire body.

Silas O'Hara, aged 45 years, employed as a carpenter by the Pennsylvania Railroad Company, died Friday at the Memorial Hospital as the result of an accident he met with while at Sang Hollow on March 12, when he was struck in the abdomen by a board. He had been a member of the hospital since March 13. An autopsy was held at the hospital, by Dr. H. B. Anderson and Dr. John L. Sagerman, who said that O'Hara's death was due to peritonitis. The deceased is survived by his widow and 11 children.
