Going on Pension
CRESSON—Having been an employee of the Pennsylvania Railroad Company, the Cresson Division for years, Henry Potter Hibbs, 87, of this place, was placed on the honor roll of the Pennsylvania system. He accepted a position as brakeman on the Pennsylvania line, on the Middle Division, November 10, 1879, and was transferred to the position of fireman, February 1, 1880, and served in the Altoona Yard Division. In April 1887, he was promoted to engineer on the Cresson Division, where he served in that capacity up to this time. Mr. Hibbs is 87 years of age.

Several sons of Henry Hibbs are in the employ of the Pennsylvania Railroad Company, including Charles Hibbs, assistant foreman of engines of the Cresson Division, Ray Hibbs, passenger conductor on the Cresson Division, and Harry Hibbs, Jr., who is employed at the Cresson engine house.

On April 1, Lloyd Alexander Cherry of Cresson was retired voluntarily after 42 years service with the Pennsylvania Railroad Company. His first work with the company was a laborer in 1881. He became a fireman in the freight service July 1, 1890, and was promoted to freight engineer October 18, 1890. Mr. Cherry plans to make his father's home in Bellwood, where he owns a very comfortable home and where his children reside. He is 66 years of age.

To Improve Cresson Highway.
The County Commissioners while in session Friday passed a resolution whereby the County Contractor has been requested to advertise for bids for the reconstruction of the Cresson Pike. The improvement is to be made from a point 600 feet more or less west of the fourth mile now in place, and extending to the culvert under the Pennsylvania Railroad, thence by the southern side of the P. R. R. to a point approximately 600 feet east of the Emerald Park crossing of the present road, thence by way of the same to the William Pen Highway west of Cresson Road, a distance of 17,200 feet. The road is to be constructed of bitum on a concrete base 16 feet wide.
