EARLY TELEPHONE CONCERTS LIKE RADIO PROGRAMS NOW

In the introduction of radio to the public the first great attraction was the broadcasting of concerts. It was the same when the telephone was being introduced to the public. An instance of this occurred in Michigan the first time a telephone instrument was brought into the state.

On March 6, 1877, a telegraph operator by the name of W. A. Jackson arrived in Detroit with a telephone set in his valise. He exhibited the instruments at the Detroit Club. Much interest was aroused. This interest became widespread when the telephone was attached to a telegraph wire from Chicago and a musical program being rendered in the distant city was distinctly heard in Detroit.

Flying Grasshoppers.
A species of grasshopper known to be capable of flying great distances is at times found far from land. The bureau of entomology recently received one of these insects which had been captured at sea, 12,000 miles from the African coast.
