Howard L. Dinsmore.

Although not unexpected, the death of Howard L. Dinsmore at his home here last evening, came as a token of sorrow to his hundreds of friends in Patton and in Northern Cambria County.

Coming to Patton a quarter century ago, when still a young man, he, by his initiative and industry, was largely instrumental in founding and building up the tailoring business of Dinsmore Bros., and as a member of that now prosperous firm, gained a large acquaintanceship.

As a tradesman, he was remarkable. He was generally conceded to be one of the best cutters in this section of the country. His work was rapid, but painstaking. His product always caused entire satisfaction to all patrons.

Howard L. Dinsmore, familiarly known as "Doby" to practically everyone in this and the adjacent community, was called by his Maker in the prime of life. He was of a pleasing disposition, and was an excellent judge of human nature. Although never actively interested in local government, he at all times displayed the interest of a good citizen, and promoted the advantages of Patton each time the opportunity was afforded. In fraternal circles he was active, and held at one time the position of Worshipful Master of the Patton Lodge, No. 658, Free and Accepted Masons.

The last year of his life was spent in comparatively ill health, but, nevertheless, he continued at his duties until forced to forego them.

As the brother of one of the editors of this newspaper, who has worked with him since youth, his memory will remain forever; his guidance in business affairs will be lacking, and his congenial fellowship to both the members of Dinsmore Bros., and their employees, will be sadly missed in the years to come.

Frank Connell Cancer Victim.
 W. Frank Connell well known throughout Northern Cambria county died at his apartments at the Ft. Stanwix Hotel, Johnstown last Thursday morning at 1:30 o'clock after a prolonged illness of cancer aged 53 years.

Mr. Connell was born in Ebensburg and removed to Johnstown shortly after the flood where he secured employment with the Johnstown Company, now the Lorain Steel Co. He was a member of the Johnstown Lodge of Elks and for the past 15 years served as secretary.
