Tax is Unconstitutional.
 West Virginia legislators who endeavored to restrict the transportation of oil and gas to other states by imposing a tax on oil and gas carried ten miles or more by pipe line, found their efforts vain when the United States Supreme Court a few days ago decided such a tax unconstitutional.

The Steptoe act of 1919 was the specific law frowned upon by the highest court in the land. Pennsylvania and Ohio contested the act on the plea that it obstructed interstate commerce and that it was inconsistent with the commerce clause of the Federal Constitution. Incidentally the West Virginia Supreme Court anticipated the decision of the higher tribunal by declaring the act unconstitutional.

Michael Platt.
 Michael Platt, aged 44 years, of Hastings, died Sunday afternoon at the County Home, where he had been an inmate for a week. His death was due to a complication of diseases. The body was turned over to Undertaker George Ondrizek, of Ninty-Glo, to prepare for burial and was taken to Hastings.

Cambria Arranges Three Shifts—
JOHNSTOWN.—Employees, representatives and plant officials agreed on a gradual elimination of the 12-hour day and the substitution of an eight hour day at the Cambria Steel Works. The new schedule goes into effect Thursday and will affect more than 15,000 employees in the Cambria plant. The change will require several months to complete and depends finally on an adequate supply of labor. Some of the departments will go on a 10-hour day on Thursday, others on an eight-hour day. An agreement also was reached relative to a readjustment in wages. A graduated scale will be put into effect, with no increase to exceed 25 per cent on the present wage basis.

Applies for Charter.
 An application for a charter for the Colonial Social & Athletic Association of Johnstown, was filed Monday by Attorney E. Edgar Leashey, of Johnstown. The purpose of the petitioners is to maintain a charitable, social and athletic organization; also to provide and maintain a home or suitable building for the accommodation of the club members. The petitioners are Earl Adams, John Empfield, William Andrews, Albert Skanieszky and George A. Leashey.

Slot Machine Ruling Coming—
ALTOONA.—Are nickle-in-the-slot machines gambling devices? This question is to be decided in the Blair county court. An Altoona constable proceeded against William H. Engle, a hotel proprietor, for having set up an alleged gambling device. The machine vended candy, chewing gum and checks. It was confiscated. Engle's counsel brought an injunction suit against the officer, charging that the machine was operated within the law and that its confiscation and the resultant loss of trade was a hardship on Engle. Because a legal opinion, District Attorney Marion D. Patterson declared that injunction law would not hold good in a criminal case. If it would, he said, every man charged with a crime could stay the wheels of justice in the manner. Judge Thomas J. Baldrige put the case over to the October term, ordered the constable to keep the machine, and warned other vendors to turn their machines toward the wall until after the determination day by Attorney E. Edgar Leashey, of the Engle case.
