Hearken to This, Motorists—
 MEADVILLE—Of 3,504 motorists observed by special Erie railroad police guards at grade crossings in the vicinity of Meadville during July, 2, 44 of them did not stop, look or listen at the crossings, according to a report made by the observers.

Central Coal Out Grows—
 ALTOONA—Coral Pennsylvania coal operators report car loadings for the week ending August 5 were 17,881 cars, against 15,892 for the week ending July 29. Production in this field for the first seven months of the year totaled 30,309 tons, as compared with 15,106 tons for the same period last year, four months of which were covered by the miners' strike. Prices are not appreciably changed ranging from \$2 to \$3, depending on the grade of coal.
 Head Cut Off—
 OIL CITY—Driven through a pile of rocks when the truck he was driving, loaded with 2,000 pounds of bricks, dashed off the road on a hill near Clintonville late Tuesday, John Pete, construction company employe, had his head completely cut off. The man was 35 years old and lived at University, near Pittsburgh. He was driving the truck down the hill and apparently lost control. The coroner decided no inquest would be necessary.

Beaver Man Dies of Rabies—
 BEAVER—Fear of an epidemic of rabies was expressed here, after Frank McKee, electrical engineer, was attacked by a mad dog on June 25. The same dog, it is said, bit a number of other animals before it was killed. McKee died in convulsions Saturday night.

Buffalo-Pittsburgh Pike Named—
 FRANKLIN—Suggestion that the highway from Buffalo to Pittsburgh be named the Colonel Drake highway was given unanimous endorsement this week by the Franklin Kiwanis Club. Similar action is to be taken by the Rotary Club at the next week's meeting.

ORDINANCE No. 162.

An Ordinance of the Borough of Patton authorizing the grading, paving and curbing of Fourth Avenue from MaGee Avenue south to Lang Avenue, and providing for the cost of the collection of the same.

Section 1. Be it enacted and ordained by the Burgess and Town Council of the Borough of Patton, and it is hereby enacted and ordained by the authority of the same:

That whereas, the condition of Fourth Avenue, beginning at MaGee and extending to the southern side of Lang Avenue is badly in need of repair; and that the traffic over said street is such as to make it necessary, sooner or later, to permanently improve the same by paving with brick or other hard surfacing material; and it has been ascertained that it would be more practical and economical to improve said street at the present time than at a later date. Therefore,

IT IS ENACTED AND ORDAINED that said street, beginning at the south side of Lang Avenue, be properly graded, curbed and paved with vitrified paving bricks or blocks, and that the alleys and approaches to said street be graded, curbed and paved in conformity to the street proper, according to plans and specifications prepared or to be prepared by the Borough Engineer and approved by Council.

That the Borough Engineer fix the grades, prepare plans and specifications, and that a contract to do the work be entered into with the lowest responsible bidder, after due advertisement.

Section 2. That the Borough Engineer in charge of said work, shall make an estimate of the total cost of the improvement, when completed, and shall assess two thirds of the cost thereof to the real estate owners abutting on said street, and the balance of one third to the Borough of Patton.

Section 3. That the municipal assessors in charge of the grading, paving and curbing, or otherwise improving of said street shall be filed with the Borough Secretary of the Borough of Patton, who shall give thirty days written or printed notice to the parties assessed, either by service on owner of agent, or left upon the assessed premises, that the assessments are due and payable. If said assessments, or any of them, shall remain unpaid at the expiration of said notice the same shall be paid in the hands of the Borough Secretary, whose duty it shall be to collect the same, together with five per cent. additional as attorney's commission and interest from the completion of the grading, curbing and paving of said street by municipal order, due to the premises, against which said assessments may issue.

Section 4. That the Borough Engineer, hereby directed to advertise for the grading, curbing and paving, or otherwise improving of said street, according to plans and specifications prepared or to be prepared hereunder, and to be approved by the Council, who will meet on the 20th day of August, 1923.

Section 5. That this Ordinance shall be duly advertised as required by law, and transcribed in the Ordinance Book of the Borough of Patton, and that notice of the passage of the Ordinance be published by hand bills, for ten days, as required by law.


