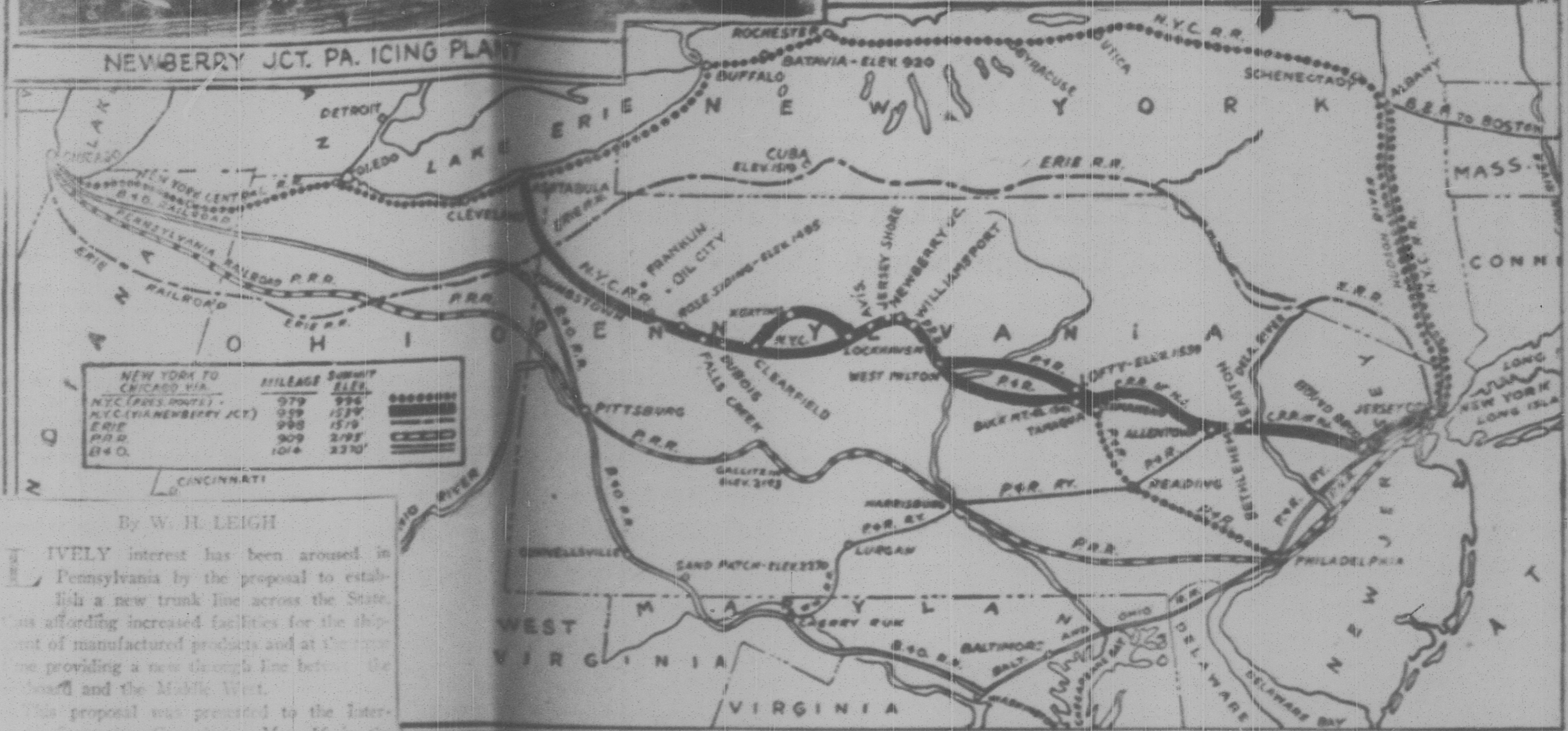
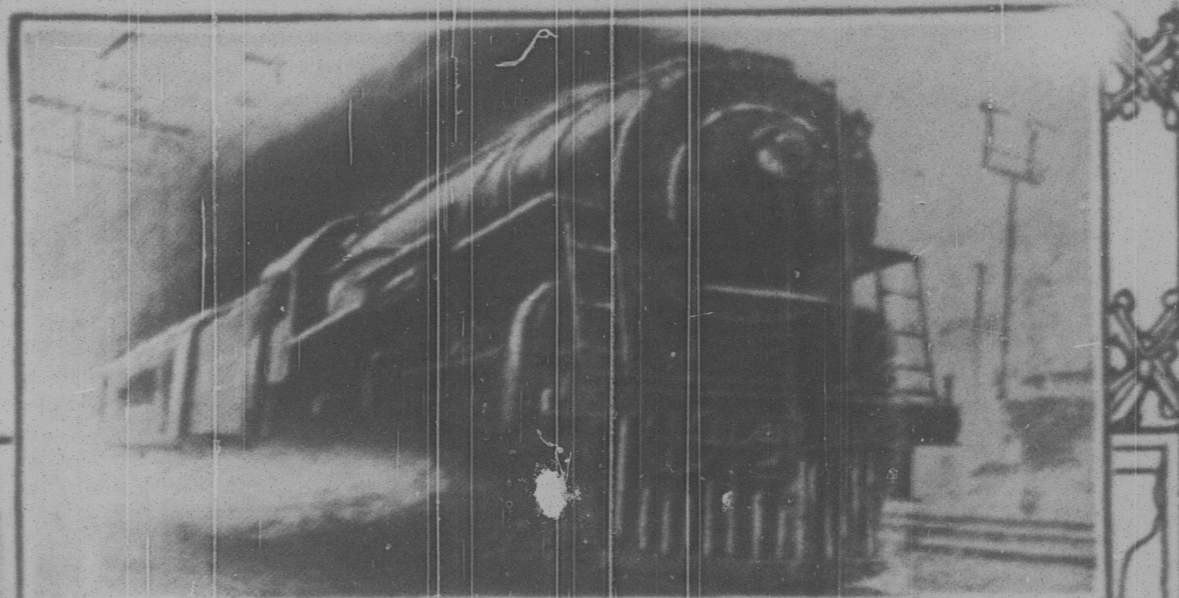
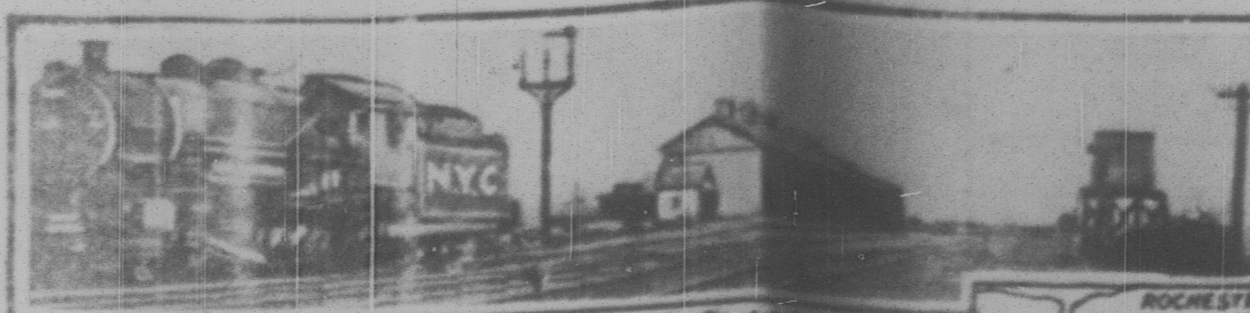

New Trunk Line for Pennsylvania



At Newberry, Pa., the new line would form a junction with the existing main line of the New York Central between New York, Buffalo, Cleveland, Chicago and St. Louis.

The new line would be the second shortest between New York City and Chicago, being only 529 miles long, as compared with the Pennsylvania Railroad's 600 miles. Third would come the Erie with 598 miles, and fourth the Baltimore & Ohio Railroad with 1,124 miles.

The proposed route crosses the summit of the Alleghenies at an elevation of 1,539 feet, as compared with a summit elevation of 995 feet on the present New York Central water-level route, 1,515 feet on the Erie, 2,193 feet on the Pennsylvania main line and 2,279 feet on the Baltimore & Ohio.

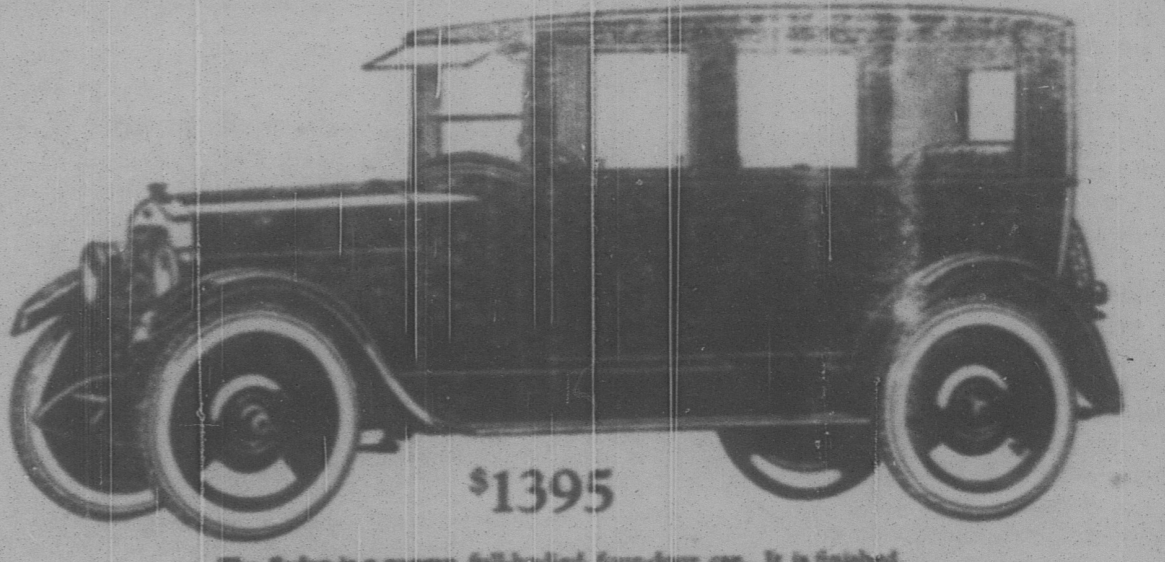
FIRE SWEEPS GOLF STATION
