### BOYS' AND GIRLS' CALF CLUB ROUND-UP PLEASES

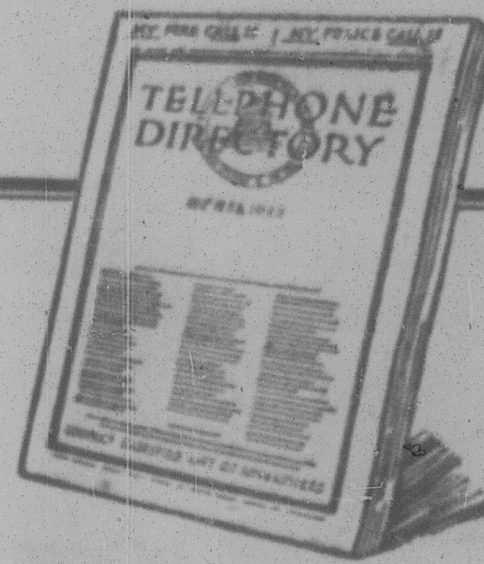

There was a busy scene about the live stock tent when the boys and girls began to curl brush and wash the calves' hair for the showing. The ability of the boys and girls was clearly shown by the time it took to judge the animals. A man from State College acted in that capacity. 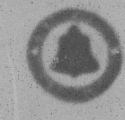

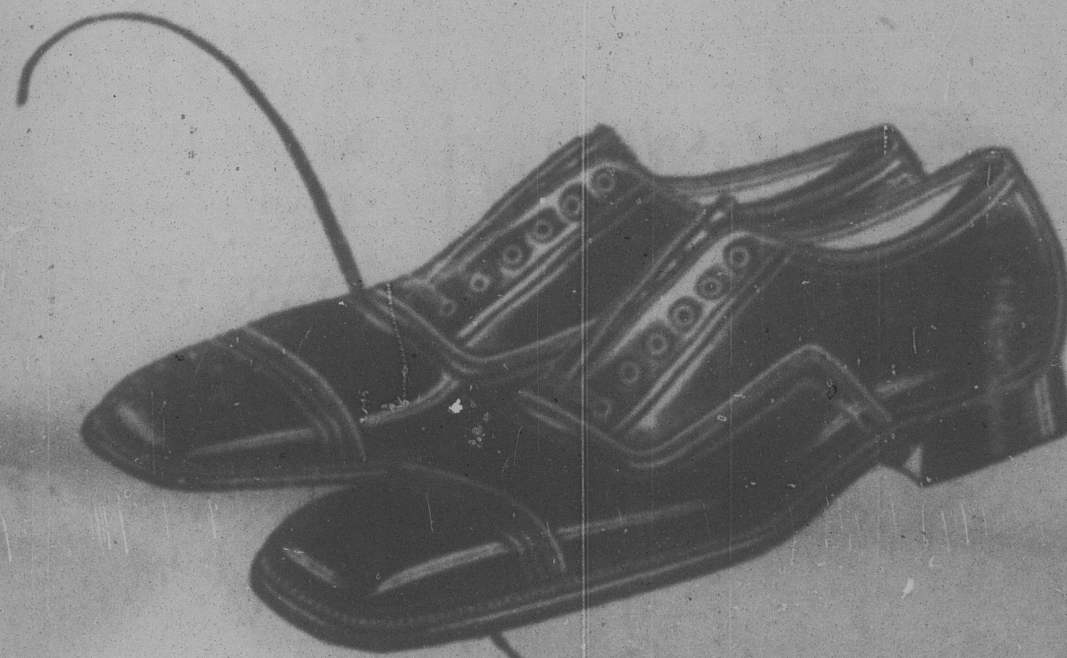
