COAL PRODUCTION FELL OFF DURING PAST YEAR

Altoona, Jan. 2.—According to figures made public Friday by Charles O'Neil, secretary of the Central Pennsylvania Coal Producers' Association, the commonwealth's coal production fell 10,000,000 tons during the past year.

Indications point to a still higher production among non-union mines this year, than was attained last year, Mr. O'Neil said.

Records of the bituminous coal production in the commonwealth show the record for 1924 to be the lowest since 1909, with the exception of the year 1922.
