HOUSEKEEPING HINTS

Though the housecleaning time of spring is just some weeks ahead, it is a good time to look through linen closets, drawers in dressers and chiffoniers, reeking the drawers and making an inventory of supplies.

This is now a good time to make a half-dozen broom heads to use in the cleaning of the walls and floors. These may be made from old outing flannel nightgowns.

Another large basket to hold up fruit, canned foods and vegetables from the cellar will save many steps. The empty cans may be carried down to the storeroom in the same basket.

While shut in during the rainy or cold weather is a good time to repair all summer clothing and get ready for the days that may be spent out of doors.

WESTERN UNION UPHELD BY COURT

Compliance With Daylight Saving Custom in Pittsburgh Declared Legal

COMPLAINT IS DISMISSED

Interesting News Items, Briefly Condensed, Picked Up at the Department Which Are Of Interest To the People Of the State.

Harrisburg, Pa.—The daylight saving law was not transgressed by Western Union Telegraph Co. in Pittsburgh last summer when it adjusted the clocks of its customers one hour ahead in compliance to the daylight saving observance in that city.

Nelson complained to the commission that the Western Union Co. had violated the Derrick law of 1923 which established eastern standard time as the sole and uniform legal standard of time.

According to a State Highway Department announcement the State has a red in pickle for many motor drivers and some may be arrested March 1. In a formal statement issued today, the department says, "Records of the Department show that 785,458 drivers of automobiles are without their 1925 licenses. This means 42.60 applications must be received daily during the balance of February."
