MORE THAN 150 CASES WILL GO BEFORE GRAND JURY AT MARCH SESSION

Alex Cover, of Johnstown, Will Be Re-tried for Alleged Fraud in Election.

More than 150 cases will be called before the Grand Jury for the March session of the Criminal Court, according to the preliminary list of cases announced from the office of the district attorney. The number case will go before the jury on the commonwealth seeking to indict the defendant, Victor McDermott, grand jury member, May, Mayne, McElroy, and for other. Contracting Co. Sues.

Said to have been entered by the U. G. Contracting Company of Philadelphia against Fred Blain, Jr., of this county to recover \$3,000 damages.
