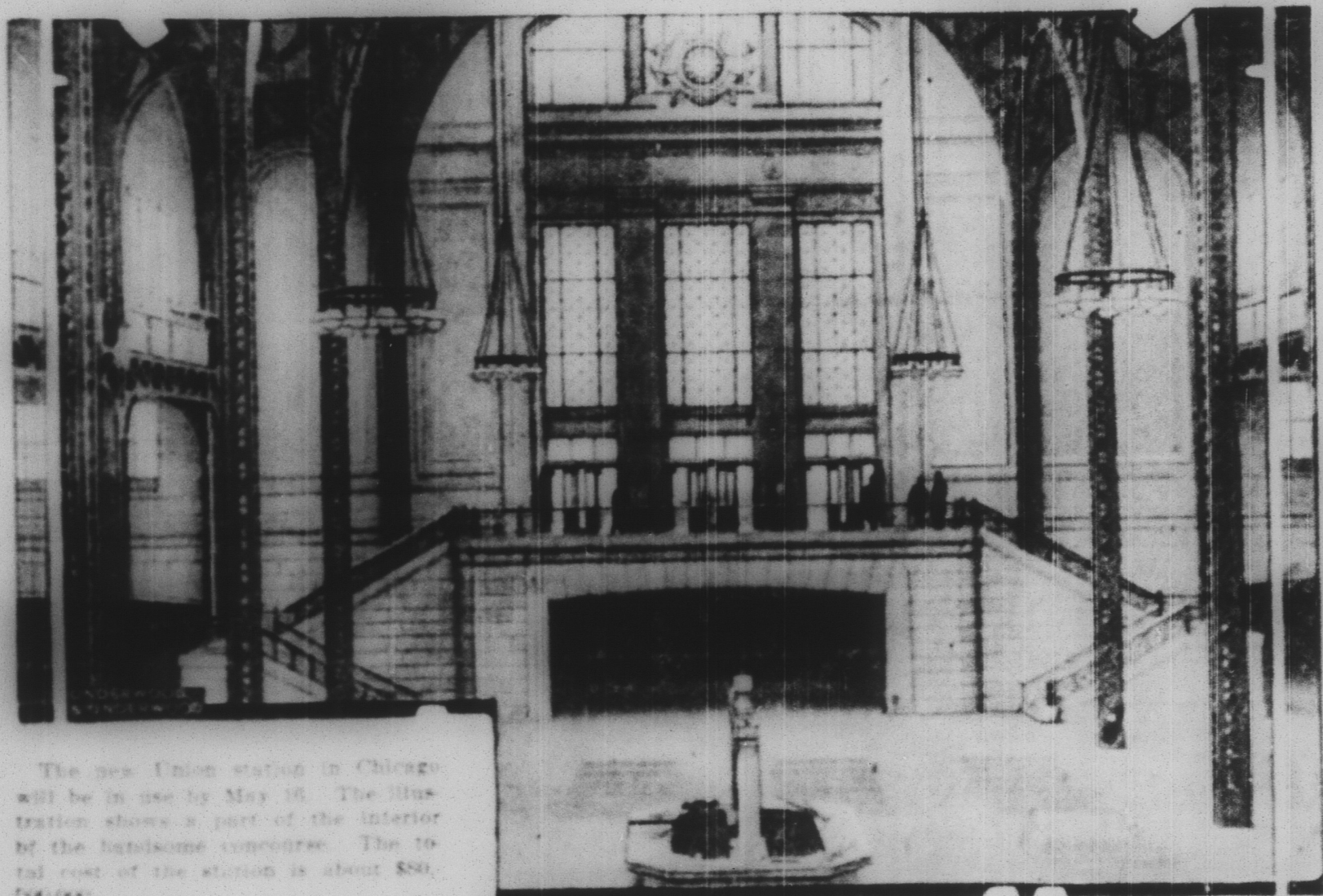
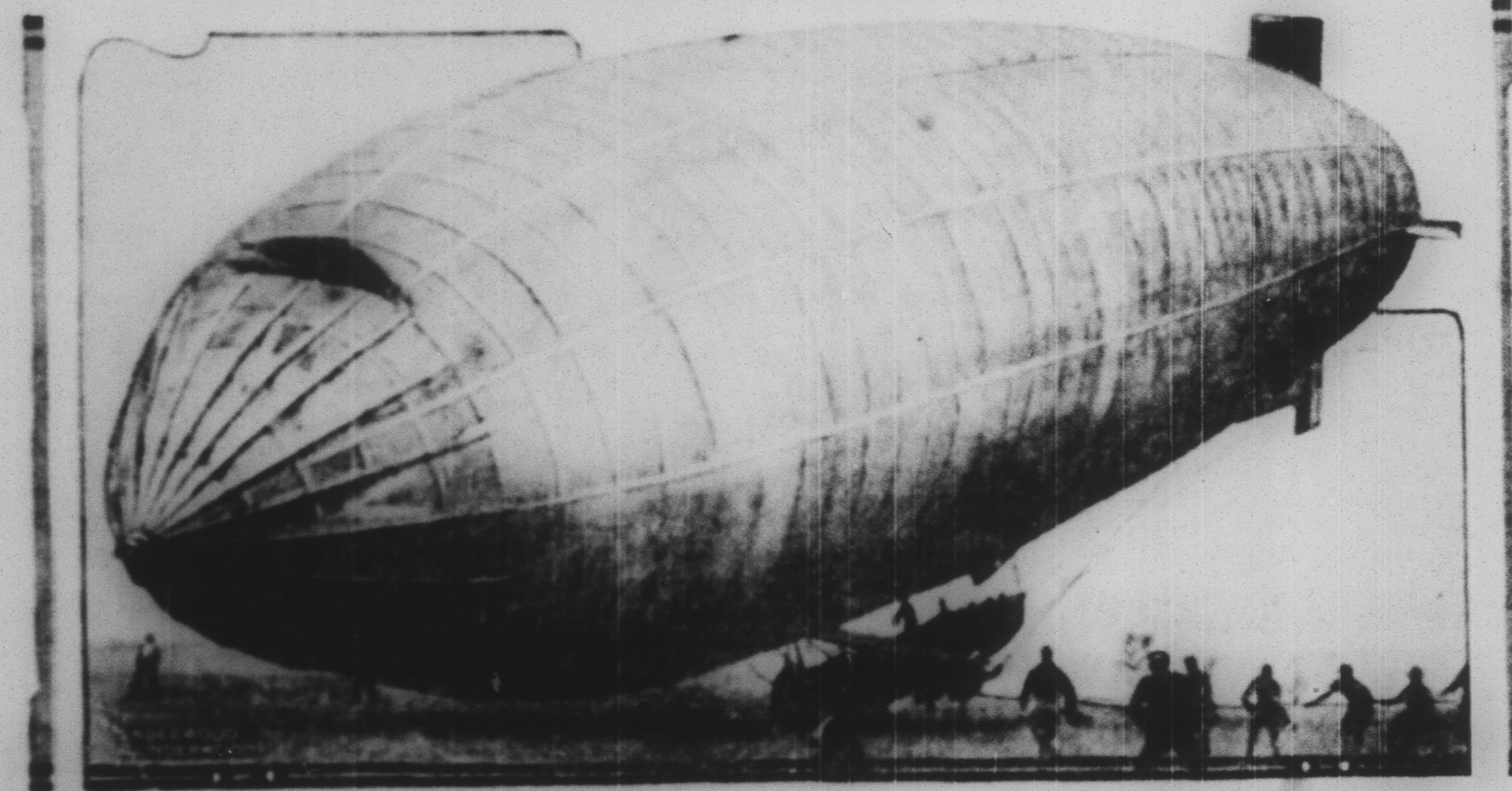


View in New Union Station at Chicago

Mrs. Josiah A. Van Orsdel of Washington, D. C., who was elected national president of the children of the American Revolution at the 1925 meeting.



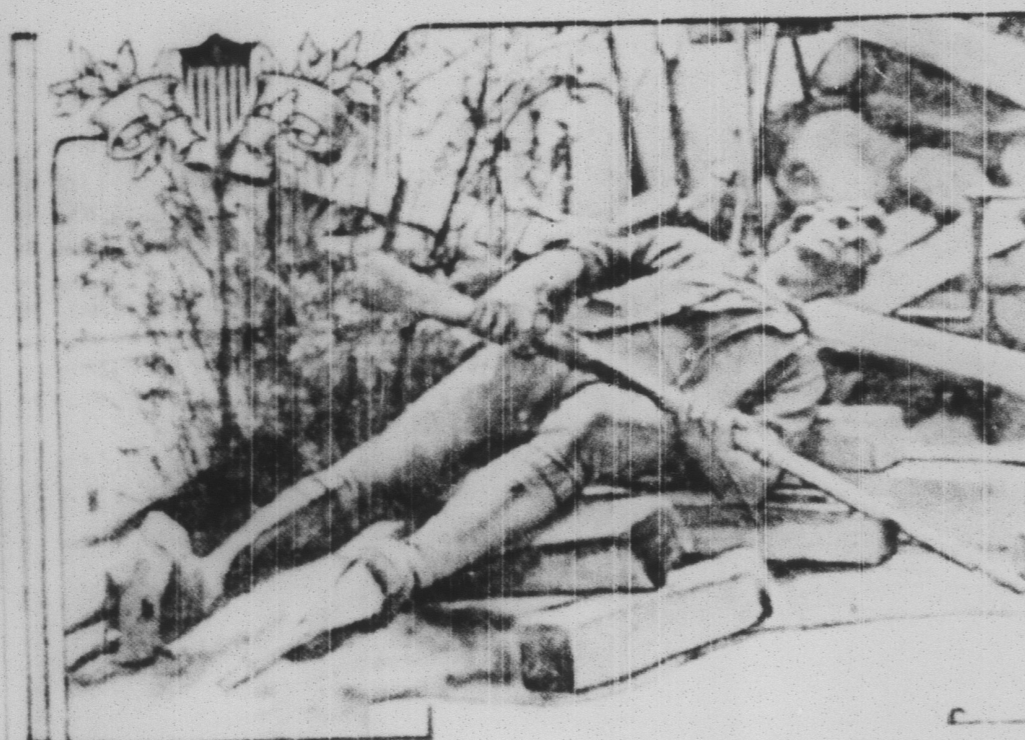

REFRESHING JELLIED DISHES

When hot food does not appeal, it is indeed refreshing to have some cooling mold of jelly which not only delights the eye but pleases the palate.

Apple Jelly is the foundation for numberless good dishes. To make the jelly, wash and core apples in a well-seasoned brown or white stock.

Brown stock is made from a shin of beef or veal combined with veal bones, coming from a young animal, contain much gelatin, which makes a thick gelatin of itself without the addition of the commercial gelatin.

The liquor in which a chicken is cooked makes a very choice white stock. Veal and chicken combined are often used.

The liquor in which fish is cooked may be used as the stock for molded fish.

A quick aspic may be prepared by dissolving meat extract, or bouillon cubes, one cube for each cupful of water, and one teaspoonful of the extract in one cupful of water and a teaspoonful of gelatin. Canned bouillon may be used. The jelly should be well seasoned and stiff enough to hold its shape when turned out of the mold.

To clarify the stock to make a clear aspic, which is the real aspic, add two slightly beaten eggs and the crushed shells to each quart of stock. Boil over the fire and stir slowly but constantly until the mixture boils. Boil ten minutes, remove from the fire and allow it to stand ten minutes to settle. Strain through a cheese cloth.

Peas, Peanut and Olive Salad.—Take one cupful of cooked green peas, one cupful of chopped celery, three-fourths dozen finely minced olives. Blend all the ingredients and mix with a highly seasoned salad dressing. Serve on lettuce.

Peanut Butter Biscuit.—Take two cupfuls of flour, four teaspoonfuls of baking powder, one-half teaspoonful of salt. Sift these ingredients together. Add one-half cupful of sugar, one-half cupful of shortening, one-half cupful of egg yolks, one-half cupful of milk. Mix and roll into a sheet, spreading the peanut butter and sprinkling with the raisins; roll up and cut in slices and bake in a hot oven for fifteen minutes.

Raspberry Jam Sandwiches.—Cut sponge cake into thin slices. Put together with raspberry or blackberry jam. Cut into rounds or triangles.

More Good Things. As the season is on for picnics, there is no food served which is more satisfying than a good sandwich. Here are a few suggestions.

Egg Sandwich.—Take six hard-cooked egg yolks rub them to a paste, adding gradually two tablespoonfuls of olive oil, or thick cream, or softened butter. Add a dash of cayenne, one-half teaspoonful of salt, and spread on slices of buttered bread.

Anchovy Sandwiches.—Beat one-half cupful of butter to a cream, adding gradually two tablespoonfuls of lemon juice, salt and cayenne to taste and two tablespoonfuls of anchovy paste. Spread this on thin slices of bread, put two together and cut into triangles.

Fish Sandwiches.—Rub to a paste a pound of cold butter, one-half cupful of Worcestershire sauce, a tablespoonful of olive oil, salt and pepper to taste. Spread on buttered bread, arrange a lettuce leaf and cover with another slice of buttered bread.

Cucumber Sandwiches.—Prepare these just before serving. Slice peeled cucumbers thin, dip into French dressing and place on buttered bread, cover with a slice of buttered bread and serve at once. Onion may be used instead for flavor in the dressing if desired.

Veal Pie.—Take a slice of veal from the smaller part of the leg, cover with boiling water and simmer until very tender, but not broken, and add in the broth—boiling the day before using a few bay leaves and a glass essence for serving and bring the dish to a boil, about half an hour. Strain through a cheesecloth, being in the boiling point and to a pint add four tablespoonfuls each of flour and butter mixed until smooth. Season with salt, pepper, celery salt and a dash of cayenne and curry. Whip the sauce with an egg beater. Add to the veal very small onions and carrots in any amount desired, half cupful of peas and one cupful of potato balls. Mix the vegetables lightly with the meat and pour the hot sauce over all. Place small biscuits, edges just touching over the top and bake until the biscuits are brown. Lamb or beef may be used instead of veal.

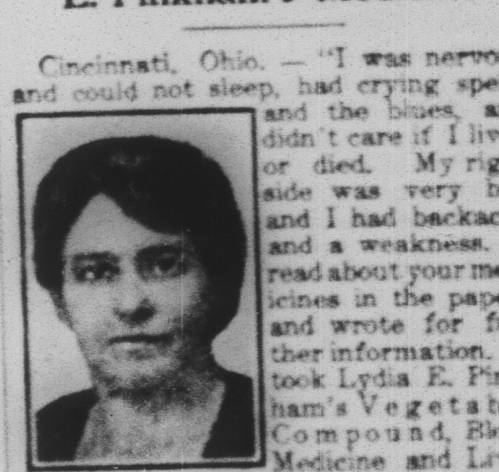
