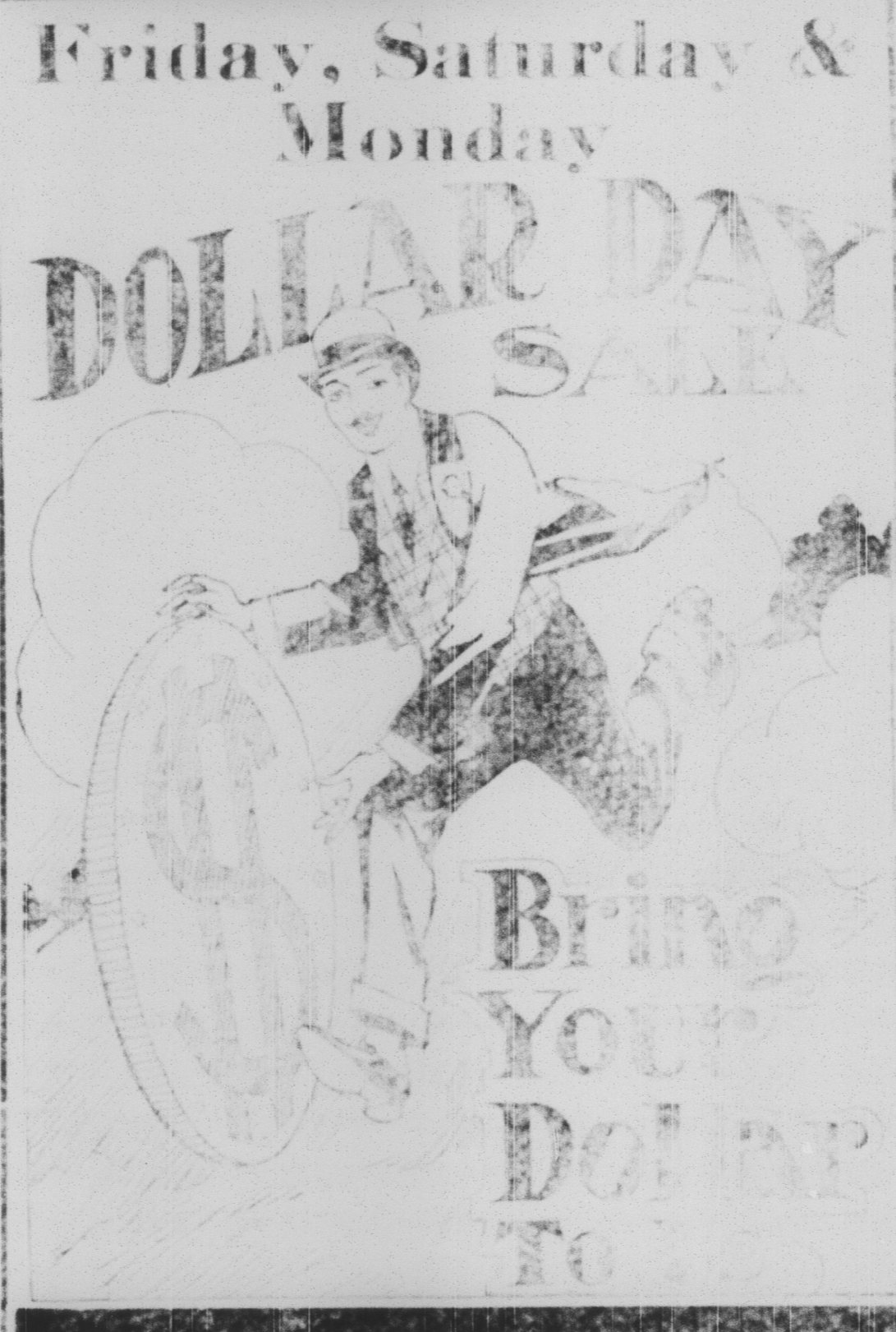

"What is needed to be remembered is that the motive of business should be one of service and cooperation," he said.

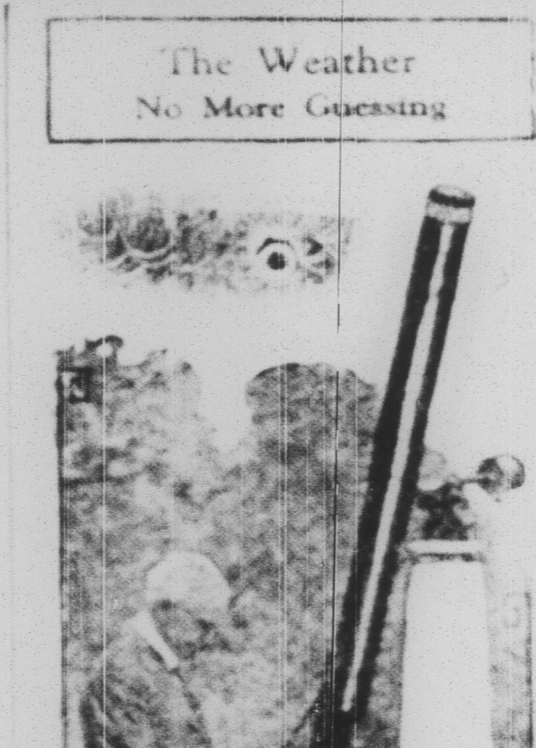
