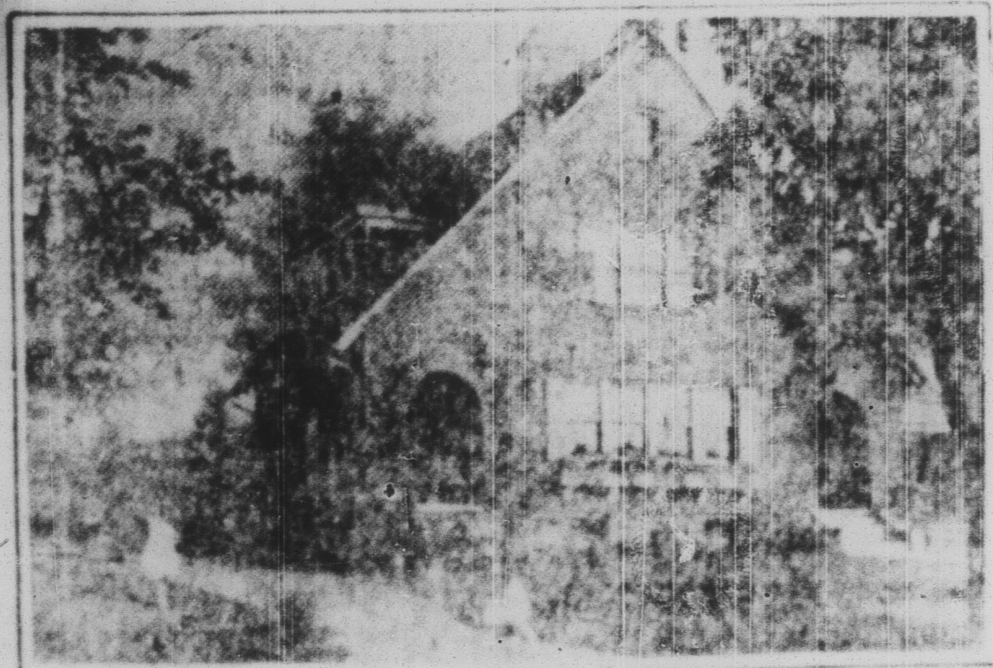
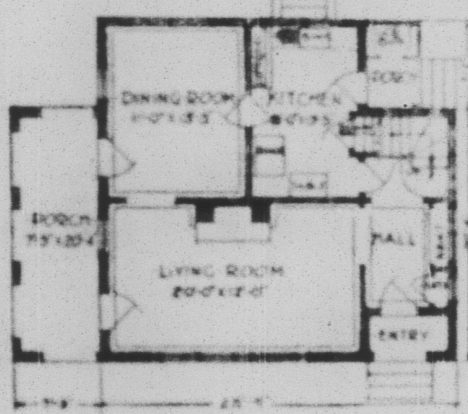


LOTS OF ROOM—MODERATE COST

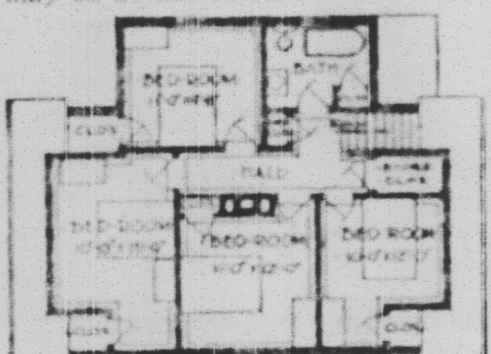


THE WYONOKAH, DESIGN A-74

Not always is it considered desirable to have the effect of a porch which faces directly upon the street.



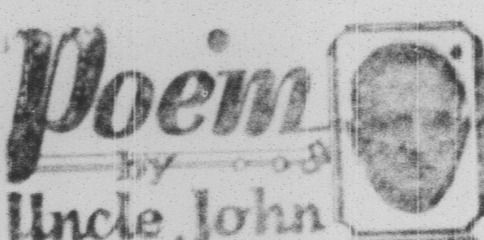
The entrance is into a wide hall upon the street. Some of the rooms are of a size which is not usual in a house of this class.

MOST ADULTS NEED EIGHT HOURS' SLEEP

Weekly Health Talk from the Pennsylvania Department of Health contains instructive news.

The health talk of the Pennsylvania Department of Health is prepared this week by Dr. Mary Rippe Niska, Chief, Pre-School section, Dr. Niska says:

Most adults need eight hours of sleep out of the twenty-four. Some need more. Few need less.

Today's work is exhausting and the night pleasures are alluring. The time of least resistance therefore is to utilize the day by doing the night's work and indulging in pastimes during the evening hours which reach far into the night.

Too many people do not seem to realize that systematic, sound sleep is one of the greatest preventatives against disease as well as one of the most powerful factors to increase longevity.

If lack of sleep sooner indicated itself in a detrimental physical reaction, it would be easier to persuade the general public to take more rest at night.

The body may be somewhat likened in this connection to a storage battery. If the battery is not recharged sufficiently, it will naturally run down sooner.

While there are outstanding cases of notable men and women who have lived long on a few hours' sleep a day, no one has the right to assume that they will fall within this most restricted class.
