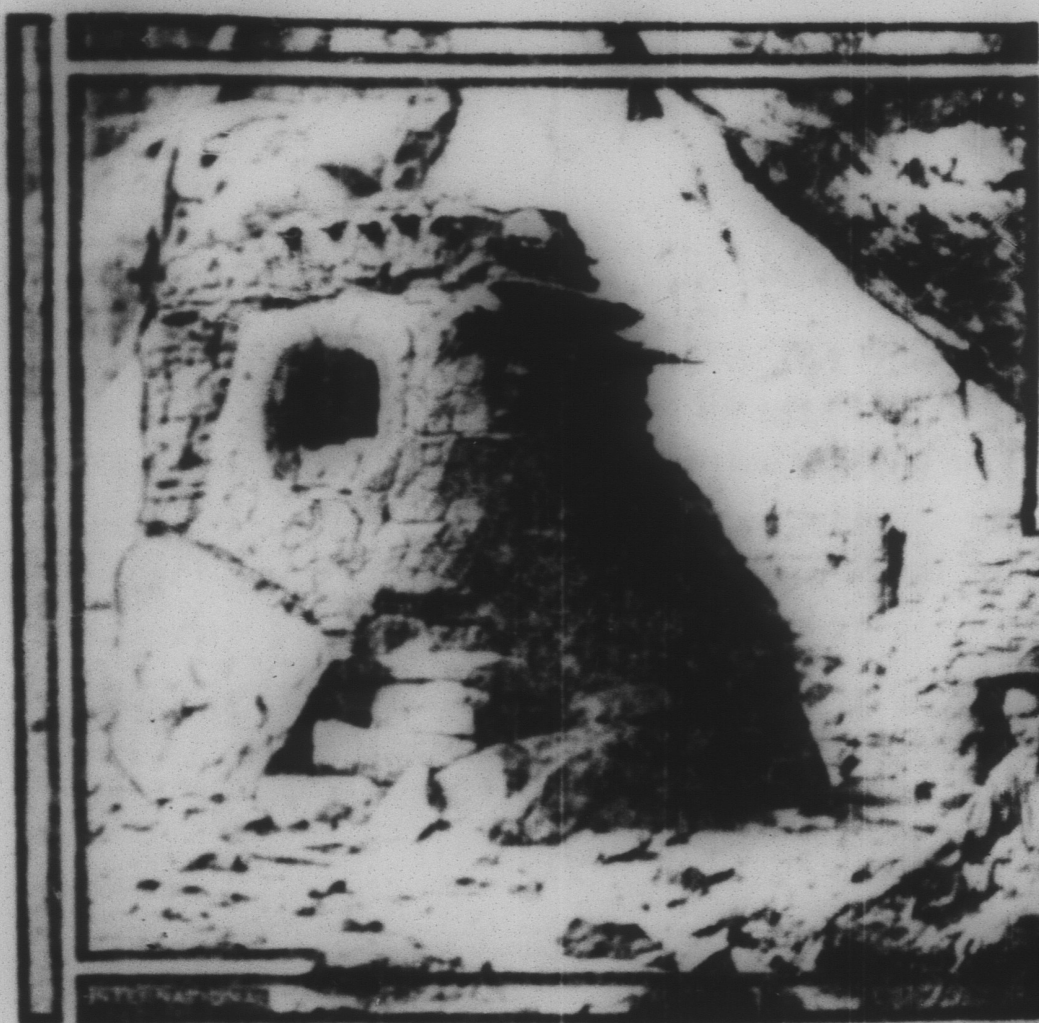
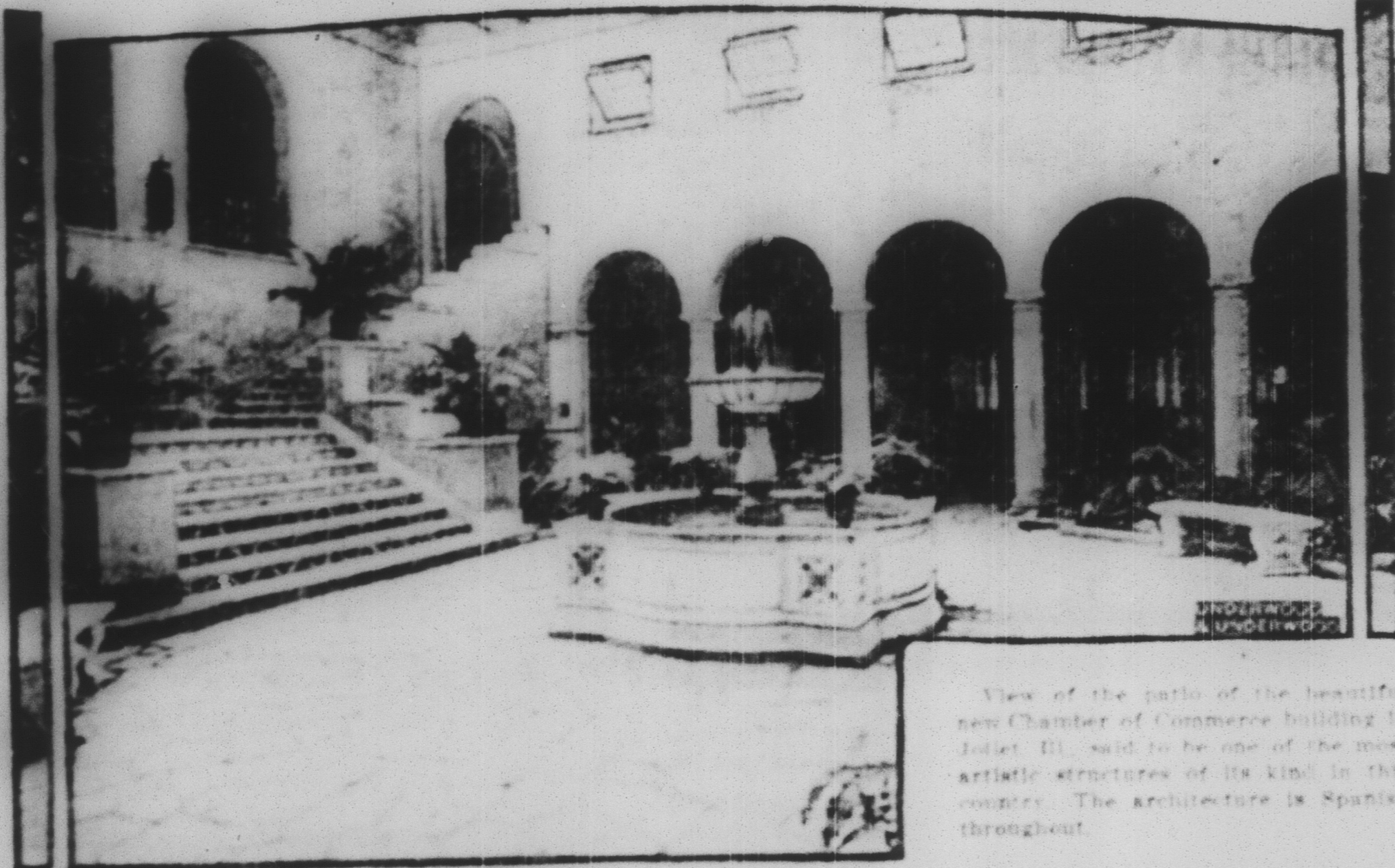

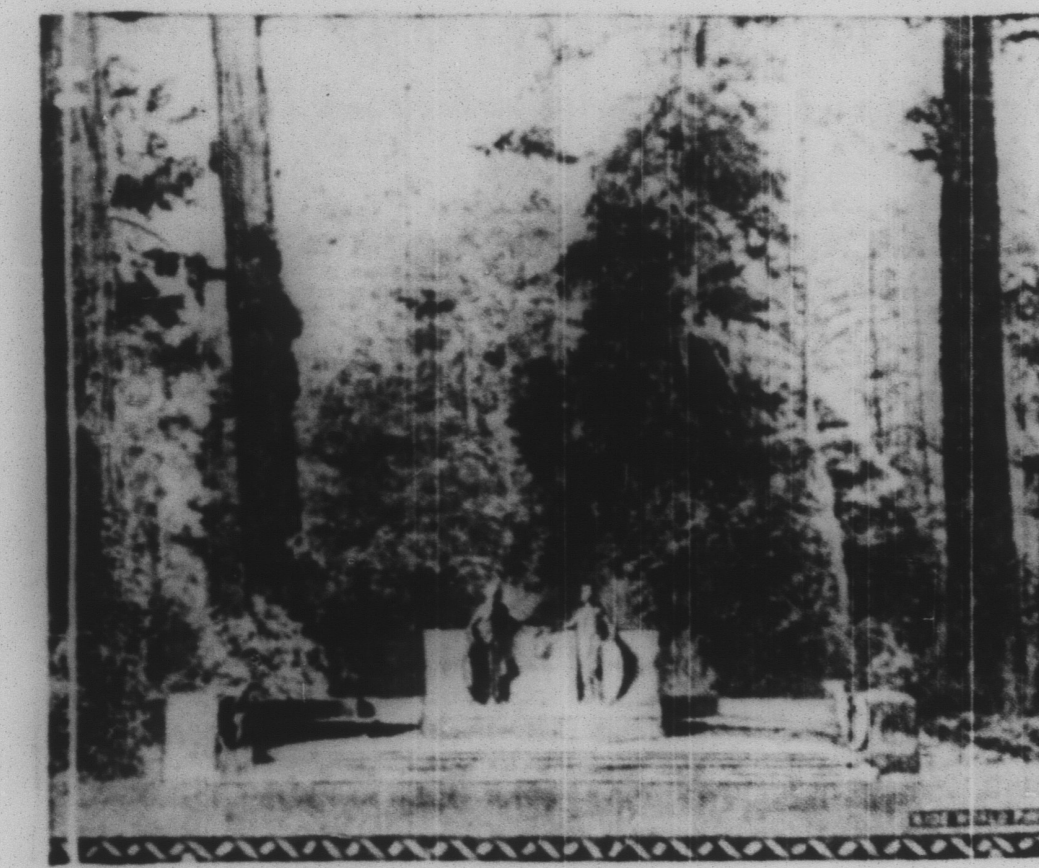
View of the path of the beautiful new Chamber of Commerce building in Joliet, Ill. said to be one of the most artistic structures of its kind in the country.

Southern Summer Squash—Cut squash in halves and let simmer in water ten minutes. Scrape out the center, leaving the shells three-fourths full.

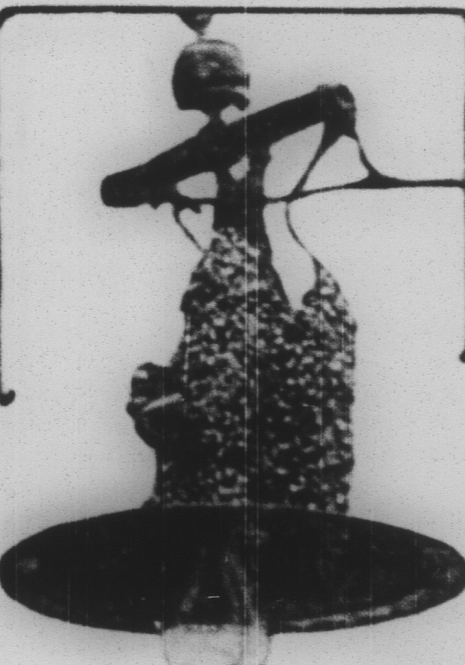
