Former Patton Resident Had A Terrible Experience While Awaiting Help.

SUFFERED OVER AN HOUR

Louis Galiardi, of Latrobe, a son of Mr. and Mrs. John Galiardi, of Fifth avenue, Patton, died at the Latrobe hospital last Thursday evening at 9 o'clock, as the result of injuries received from falling from a thirty foot bridge over the Loyalhanna Creek in the vicinity of Latrobe.

When more help arrived, the wounded man was taken to the hospital and later the foot was amputated. The operation did not save his life, probably because of infections before surgery was applied to the member.

Louis A. Galiardi left Patton for Latrobe about eleven years ago, and has since resided there. He was twice married, his first wife dying a number of years ago, and to this union two children survive: Gerald and Josephine. He is also survived by his second wife, and one child, Betty.

The funeral services will be held at the Holy Name Church in Patton on Friday afternoon at 2 o'clock.
