MUST CERTIFY THE NUMBER OF VOTERS

State Wants to Know in Advance How Many Are Qualified for Franchise.

County Commissioners this year for the first time are required to forward to the secretary of the Commonwealth a summary of all persons registered or assessed within their counties. As a result the state election bureau will know the number of persons who are entitled to vote at the November election.

Under an Act passed by the 1925 legislature and approved by the governor, all registrars, registration commissioners, assessors and registry assessors of the various municipalities and townships must furnish to the county commissioners a list of the number of persons registered or assessed. This information must be supplied immediately after the last day for registration or assessment and include enumeration by sex, color, political affiliation and whether native or foreign born. The commissioners then are required to forward this data to the Secretary of the Commonwealth.

DEATH PREMONITION SAVES LIVES OF TWO

At a point beyond Fennert Gap in Center County, Walter L. Cook, the Pennsylvania Railroad agent at Hoxend, stopped his car abruptly, and fell over the wheel, and then in another instant fell over the wheel, and he leaves a widow and a son who were with him at the time of his collapse.

Cook and his family were on their way to a garage picnic. He must have had a premonition of death, as he had the pressure of metal to start off his motor, probably saving his wife and daughter from serious injury. Cook was seventy years of age, and his death marks the end of a long life of service to the railroad.

UNIDENTIFIED MAN FATALLY INJURED

Victim Run Down By Penny Train Near Portage, Dies in Altoona Hospital.

An unidentified young man, aged about 25 years, was fatally injured on Friday afternoon when he was run down by an extra freight train on the Pennsylvania Railroad near Portage. The victim was found by the Portage Police and was rushed to the Altoona hospital, where he died on the same afternoon. He suffered a severe fracture of the skull and numerous lacerations of the body, and both legs were badly crushed. The victim also profusely and lost a considerable amount of blood.

It is said that the man had been ordered off a freight car on which he was stealing a ride, and it is supposed that another train passed in the night and struck him. The young man was rushed to the hospital without being given any surgical treatment.

There were no marks of identification on the victim's clothing. He was wearing a dark suit, a white shirt and a dark tie.

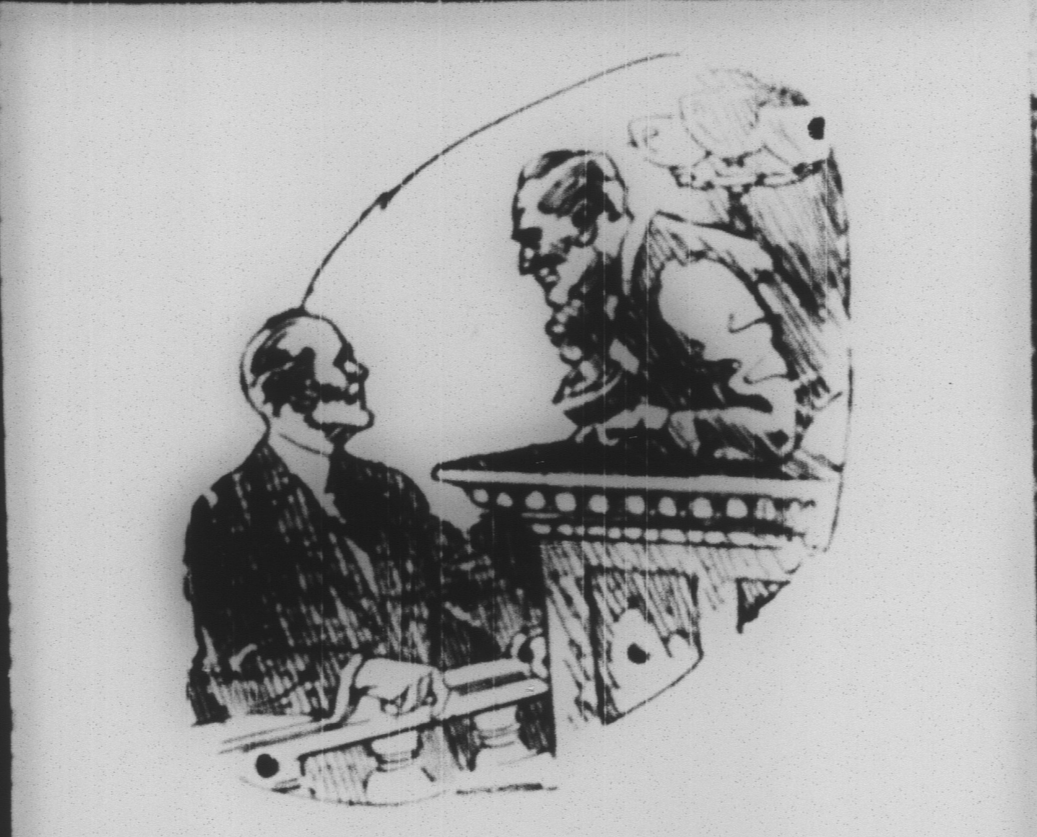
