SOUTH FORK YOUTH ADMITTED TO BAIL

Benjamin Facciani Obtains Release on Murder Charge; Habeas Corpus Hearing.

Benjamin Facciani, aged 29, of South Fork, charged with murder as the result of an automobile collision, which killed three people, was released on \$10,000 bail on Tuesday evening of last week following a habeas corpus proceeding heard by the three members of the Cambria County Court.

Facciani was charged against Facciani that he was driving at an excessive rate of speed, estimated by one witness as between 50 and 60 miles an hour. In attempting to pass another car, he struck the rear wheel hub cap and caused the Maxwell car to swerve into the ditch. His own car was wrecked a short distance away when it struck a pole.

The defendant had been in jail from the time of the accident until last Thursday evening. He will be tried at the December term of court.

Injured by Rock Fall. John Karpson, of Scranton, a hard coal miner, was probably fatally injured when caught under a fall of rock at Colver on Monday. He was badly crushed, sustaining a fracture of the pelvis and the third vertebrae. He is under treatment at the Colver hospital.

Mrs. Domencia Coyle. Mrs. Domencia Coyle, aged 72 years, died of apoplexy at her home in Gallitzin at 3:15 o'clock on Sunday morning. She had suffered a stroke a week previous. The deceased is survived by three children, Joseph and James Coyle, both of Gallitzin, and Mrs. Bradley, of Tunnel Hill.

Lawrence Sain. Funeral services for Lawrence Sain, deceased son of Mr. and Mrs. Lawrence Sain, who died at the parental home at Nicktown last Thursday were held at ten o'clock Saturday morning in St. Nicholas' Catholic Church. Interment was in the church cemetery.

GOOD METAL POLISH. A good glass and metal polish is made from one part olive oil, 1 of spirit of sal-ammoniac, 2 of lime and 1 of water, mixed to make a thick paste. Glycerine makes glass waterproof. Added to the above, the surface will be polished and protected by a somewhat permanent film.

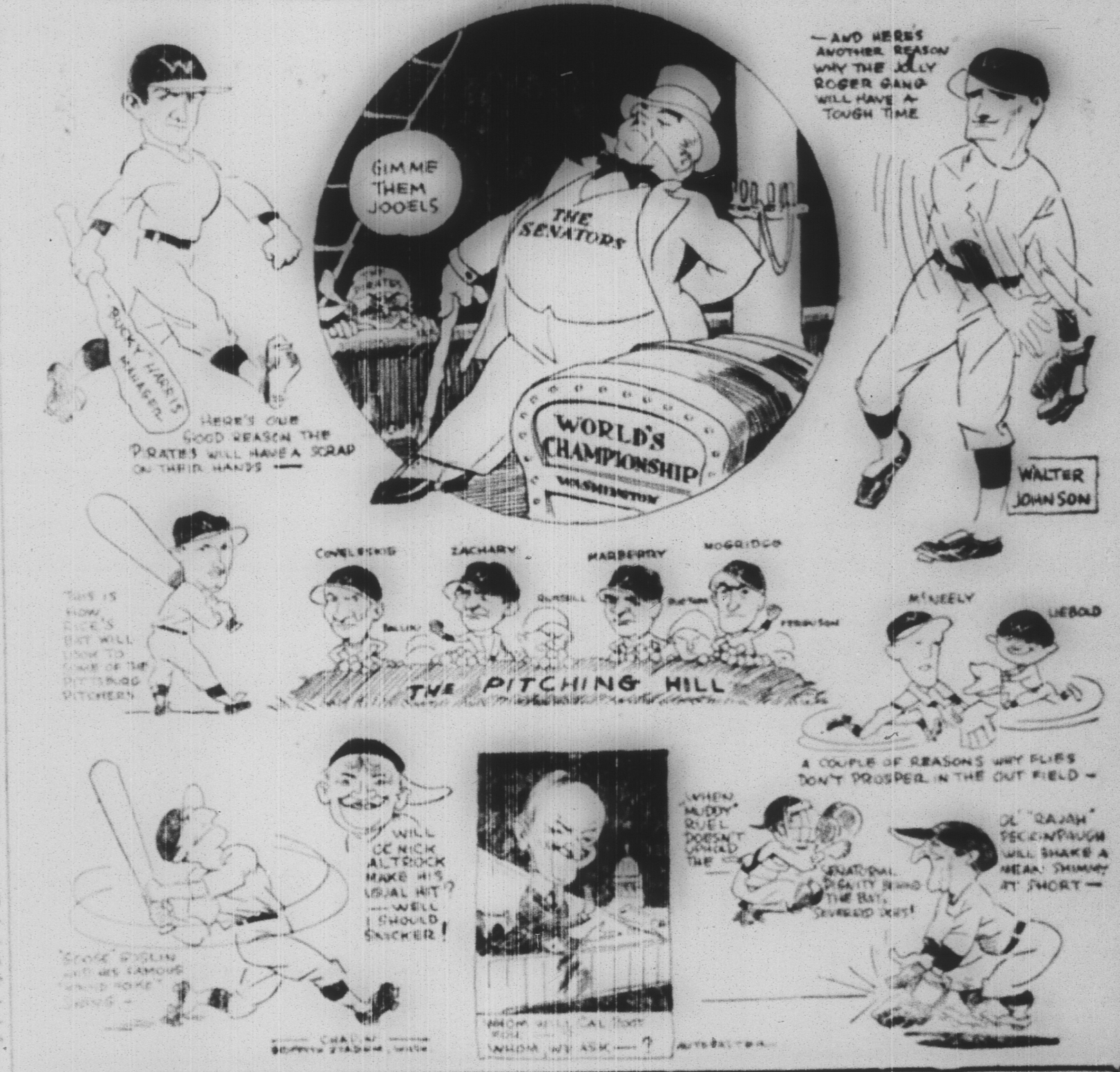
