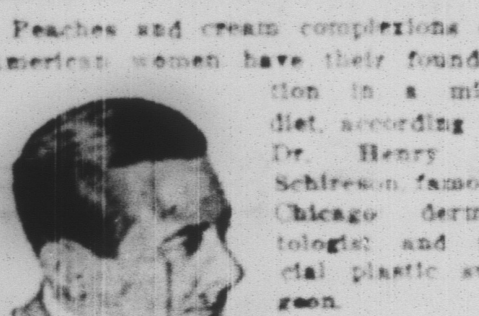

FARMERS PROTEST AGAINST HORDES OF DEER HUNTERS

Planning Organized Posting of Their Lands to Keep Out The Trespassers.

HAVE SOME CLOSE CALLS.

Under an Ebensburg date line, the following article appeared in the Juniata Tribune of last Monday evening.

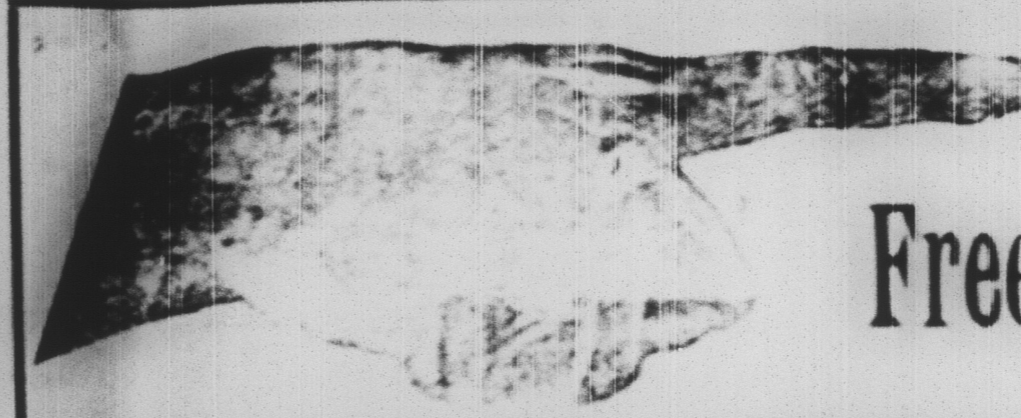
Their farms and woodlands invaded since the first of the month by several thousand experienced and inexperienced hunters of deer, the farmers of White, Clearfield and Chest townships, the northeastern section of Cambria county, abounding in deer, and probably the most extensive hunting grounds remaining in the county, are planning an organized posting of all their lands against trespassers and the issuing of certificates to desirable hunters that will be for this territory, supplementary hunting licenses.

While hundreds of hunters from Cambria county journeyed to distant fields for the deer season this year, many from the North, from Blair and Indiana counties, nearby, from many other sections of the state and from other states, including a hunter from Kentucky, poured into northeastern Cambria, commonly known as the Beaver Dams, and on the first day of the season, killed seventeen legal deer, at least one doe, and one horse.

The northeast section is comprised of woodland broken into small tracts by a large number of farms. The woods and farms are so closely related that the deer finding the farmers to be friendly, make no discrimination throughout the year between field and forest and are as much at home among the backwoods corn and wheat as they are in the undergrowth of pine, laurel and spruce in the woods. 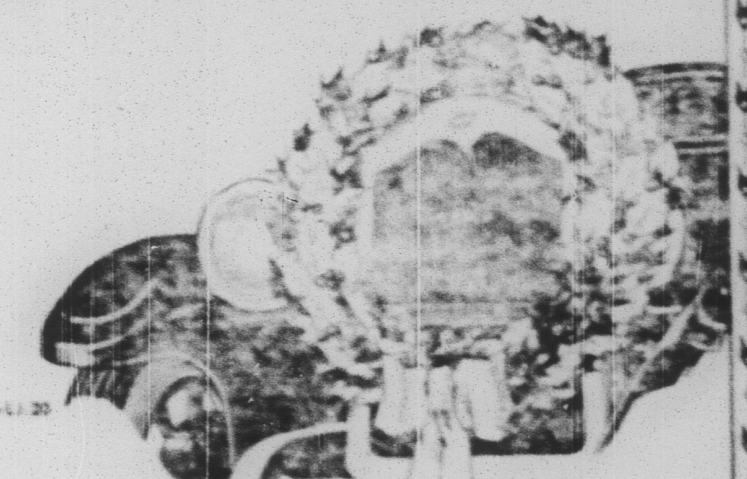


cut over and there are comparatively few large trees. The first day of the hunting season this year found the deer on as friendly terms as ever with the farmers, but early in the morning they were routed in all directions by terrifying balls of bullet striking at them from every point. Driven along their own paths they were cut off at natural deer crossings by shots from as high as twenty five guns.

At McGough's crossing and at the Burns school house crossing, as high as fifty hunters awaited deer on the first day of the season, and very often the man who asserted himself, after the buck had been brought to the ground, with the greatest show of pugnacity, or was the quickest in reaching the peep and making off with it.

The story is told of an Ebensburg hunter who drove up to one of the crossings at 7:30 o'clock in the morning of the first day of the season. He found a crowd there and parking his automobile nearby, he joined the waiting hunters. Fifteen minutes later he was on his way back to the county seat with a good sized buck in his possession.

At one crossing the first day of the season, the hunters, said to have been more than 50, were divided into two bands, the one taking the bucks coming from one direction, and the other band taking as theirs, the deer other side of the crossing from the opposite direction. But not all the hunters waited for the deer to come within range of an inescapable range of bullets as they were on the drive trail over fields, garden patches and other lands, in pursuit of the deer. Parties were crossing each other in such careless manner and bullets were flying freely that many veteran hunters in this section of the county, the first day of the season, when "traffic" in the forests and farm lands were the most congested, took discretion on the better part of valor and remained out of the drives until the next day or so. It is believed that the largest number of hunters in the history of the section have been in the "Beaver Dams" this season, and the farmers complain the largest number of inexperienced hunters. One hunter is reported to have taken a pretty shot, and a true one, and then called impulsively to his companions, nearby to view the dead animal, with him.

In the movement to post trespass notices all through the section and issue permits, claims to have dodged a number of bullets in his own property but he reached another. Last season one hour was struck five times by hunters, and another house vacant at the time, and taken over as a camp by a party of hunters, was burned to the ground. With seventeen deer killed in the northeast section the first day of the season, the total kill is expected to exceed that of last year, when 25 bucks were shot.
