MORE THAN 150 CASES WILL GO BEFORE GRAND JURY AT MARCH SESSION

Alex Cover, of Johnstown, Will Be Re-tried for Alleged Fraud in Election.

More than 150 cases will be submitted to the Grand Jury for the March term of Criminal Court in session the week beginning Monday, March 2, according to the preliminary list of cases announced from the office of the district attorney. One murder case will go before the jury, the commonwealth seeking to hold a defendant, Victor McElroy, aged 32, his mother, Mrs. Mayne McElroy, and her niece, Anna Belle Davis, aged 16, for the killing of Floyd Tyson of Johnstown, on Saturday, February 7. Several important cases, continued from the last term of court will also be tried during the March term of court. Pete Antonucci, of Spangier, charged by the Commonwealth with having had a part in the hold up of a payroll of the Ebensburg Coal Company, near Colver, and the murder of James Garman, will be tried for murder. Michele Bassi and Tony Pezz, bandits, were convicted of murder in the first degree at the December term.

Worthy Davis, alleged participant in the Lilly riot, will be tried on a charge of riot and carrying concealed weapons. Alderman Alex Cover of Johnstown, will be retried on all accusations of the election laws.

In the appended list the cases will go before the Grand Jury on the days designated, and will be tried if true bills are returned on the corresponding days of the week of March 9th.

Contracting Co. Sues.

Dick has been ordered by the U. G. Contracting Company of Philadelphia a jury, Fred Bland, Jr., of this county to recover \$3,000 damages. It is alleged that on the road leading from Abysville to Buckhorn the defendant attempted to pass a truck owned by the plaintiff and driven by one of its employees just as it was near the crossing of Chest Creek near Abysville. It is claimed that in attempting to pass this truck at a time when another car was approaching, the defendant's car hit the front wheel of the truck with such force that it tore the steering wheel from the hands of the driver, the truck broke through the retaining wall at that place and went down a bank 8 feet or more to the creek, the truck being badly damaged.
